



## 2020 TOUR Championship Broadcast & Pre-Tournament Notes

**New Scoring Format:** For the second consecutive season, the TOUR Championship is weighted by FedExCup Starting Strokes, with the format crowning a single champion; at the conclusion of the TOUR Championship, the player with the lowest score in relation to par over 72 holes combined with his FedExCup Starting Strokes will win the TOUR Championship and be crowned FedExCup champion. The FedExCup points leader after the first two Playoffs events will begin the TOUR Championship at 10-under par. The next four players will start at 8-under through 5-under, respectively. The next five will begin at 4-under, regressing by one stroke per five players until those ranked Nos. 26-30 start at even par.

**Dustin Johnson (1<sup>st</sup>):** 22-time PGA TOUR winner Dustin Johnson has led in the FedExCup standings 41 times in his career, tied-third most total weeks ranked #1 in the FedExCup since 2007.

**Fast Facts on Dustin Johnson:**

- 41** One of four players with 40 or more weeks ranked No. 1 in the FedExCup all-time
- 3** Dustin Johnson is coming off three top-two finishes in his last three TOUR starts, the only time he has finished inside the top-two in four consecutive starts was back in 2017 (*The Genesis Invitational/WON, WGC-Mexico Championship/WON, WGC-Dell Technologies Championship/WON & Wells Fargo Championship/T2*).
- 57.9** makes one eagle every 57.9 holes played this season. In the last 40 years, the best eagles per holes played frequency was Brenden Pappas (70.6 holes played per eagle) back in the 2005 season.
- 34** Is 14 strokes better than the next best player in the FedExCup Playoffs entering the TOUR Championship. Dustin Johnson is a combined 34-under par in the first two events of the 2020 FedExCup Playoffs.

**Jon Rahm (2<sup>nd</sup>):** Five-time PGA TOUR winner Jon Rahm is one of nine players who have qualified for the TOUR Championship in each of the last four seasons.

**Fast Facts on Jon Rahm:**

- 68.48** has the lowest scoring average in the FedExCup Playoffs, min 35 rounds (68.48)
- 106** One of three players 100-under par in the FedExCup Playoffs since the start of the 2017 FedExCup Playoffs
- 72.9** has the best Greens in Regulation percentage of any player in the FedExCup Playoffs (min 30 rds). Jon Rahm has hit 72.9% of his greens in regulation in his career during the FedExCup Playoffs.
- 331.1 yds** Averaged 331.1 yards on the two measured Driving Distance holes en route to victory at last week's BMW Championship, marking the longest Driving Distance average by a winner in the FedExCup Playoffs all-time.

**Justin Thomas (3<sup>rd</sup>):** 2017 FedExCup champion Justin Thomas is seeking to join Tiger Woods (2007 & 2009) and Rory McIlroy (2016 & 2019) as multiple FedExCup champions.

**Fast Facts on Justin Thomas:**

- 4** Only player who has ranked inside the top-five in Strokes Gained: Tee-to-Green in each of the last four PGA TOUR seasons.
- 1<sup>st</sup>** Leads the PGA TOUR in Par 5 Birdie or Better Percentage (56.99). Since 1980, only four players have led the TOUR in Par 5 Birdie or Better Percentage in three or more seasons. Justin Thomas has led this statistic in two prior seasons (2014-15 & 2018-19).

**Webb Simpson (4<sup>th</sup>):** Seven-time PGA TOUR winner Webb Simpson has qualified for the TOUR Championship for the eighth time in his PGA TOUR career and fourth consecutive season.

**Fast Facts on Webb Simpson:**

- 68.866 / 67.97** Has the best Scoring Average and Scoring Average (Actual) of any player this season. Simpson is on pace to have the best actual Scoring Average in a single season of any player
- 1<sup>st</sup>** leads the PGA TOUR this season in Round 2 Scoring Average (67.08)
- 166** Leads the PGA TOUR with 166 rounds of 66 or better since the start of the 2009 season (*40 more rounds than the next best player*)

**Collin Morikawa (5<sup>th</sup>):** One of nine players who've qualified for the TOUR Championship for the first time in their PGA TOUR careers.

**Fast Facts on Collin Morikawa:**

- 5** One of five players under the age of 25 to qualify for the TOUR Championship this season, marking the third time in the last five seasons with five or more players under 25 to make qualify for the TOUR Championship.
- 71.6% / 48** One of five players inside the top 30 of the FedExCup who have been better than the field in SG: Approach-the-Green in at least 70% of their measured rounds. Morikawa has the most rounds better than the field in Strokes Gained: Approach-the-Green of any player this season.

**Daniel Berger (6<sup>th</sup>):** One of five players who played in the 2019 Korn Ferry Tour Championship to qualify for the 2020 TOUR Championship this week.

**Fast Facts on Daniel Berger:**

- 75%** Third best Top-25 Finish percentage of the players to qualify for the TOUR Championship this season. Berger finished inside the top-25 in 75% of his starts this season (12 of 16).
- 68.00** Tied with FedExCup leader Dustin Johnson for the second-best combined scoring average in the Final two rounds this season with a 68.00 stroke average. Daniel Berger is the only player to not post a round over par on the weekend this season (players with 14 or more rds)

**Harris English (7<sup>th</sup>):** This season marks the second time Harris English has qualified for the TOUR Championship in his PGA TOUR career (2014-15 / 28<sup>th</sup>).

**Fast Facts on Harris English:**

- 139** Most under par of any player on TOUR this season (-139)
- 4** One of four players who ranked inside the top 30 in all 32 weeks this season (Sungjae Im, Sebastian Munoz & Lanto Griffin)
- 5** One of five players who played in the 2019 Korn Ferry Tour Championship to qualify for the 2020 TOUR Championship this week.
- 68.47** has the best Round 1 Scoring Average of any player this season (68.47)

**Bryson DeChambeau (8<sup>th</sup>):** One of 11 players to qualify for the TOUR Championship in each of last three PGA TOUR seasons (*This Season: 8<sup>th</sup> / Last Season: 12<sup>th</sup> / 2017-18: 3<sup>rd</sup>*)

**Fast Facts on Bryson DeChambeau:**

- 311.1 yds** On pace to have the longest Driving Distance (all drives) average of any player in a single season on the PGA TOUR in the ShotLink era. This season, Bryson DeChambeau is averaging 311.1 yards off the tee on all drives.
- 325.6 yds** DeChambeau is averaging **325.6** yards off the tee during the FedExCup Playoffs this season, 31.6 yards longer than the Playoffs average (294.0 yards).
- 4.72** has the third-best Birdie Average since the PGA TOUR Return to Golf (min 13 rds). Since the Charles Schwab Challenge, Bryson DeChambeau has made an average of 4.72 birdies per round on TOUR. DeChambeau has the most rounds with six or more birdies in this time frame (11) compared to just seven rounds with 6+ birdies in his first 26 rounds this season.
