Dustin Johnson – No. 1 (-10)

2019-20 season notes:

Wins: 2; Travelers Championship, THE NORTHERN TRUST

Starts: 13

Top-10s: 6

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Made his first start in the 2019-20 season at the Sentry Tournament of Championship after undergoing arthroscopic knee surgery in September; finished T7 at The Plantation Course at Kapalua.
- Won the Travelers Championship by one stroke over Kevin Streelman, returning to the winner's circle for the first time since the 2019 WGC-Mexico Championship. Extended his streak of consecutive seasons with at least one win to 13.
- Earned his fifth career runner-up finish in a major championship at the PGA Championship after taking the outright 54-hole lead at TPC Harding Park.
- Entered the FedExCup Playoffs at 15th in the standings before claiming the standings lead with his fifth victory in a FedExCup Playoffs event at THE NORTHERN TRUST. Finished with a score of 30-under par, 254 and one stroke short of the record for most strokes under par in a PGA TOUR event.
- Held a share of the 54-hole lead at the BMW Championship and rolled in a lengthy birdie from 43 feet, 3 inches on the 72nd hole to force a playoff with Jon Rahm. Was defeated by Rahm on the first hole of sudden death after Rahm holed a birdie putt from 66 feet.
- Qualified for the TOUR Championship for his 12th consecutive season and owns the most appearances at East Lake since 2007.

Jon Rahm – No. 2 (-8)

2019-20 season notes:

Wins: 2; the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide, BMW Championship

Starts: 15

Top-10s: 7

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Opened with three consecutive top-10s to begin his 2020 calendar year - T10/Sentry Tournament of Champions, 2/Farmers Insurance Open, T9/Waste Management Phoenix Open. Led into the final round at the Farmers Insurance Open but was edged by Marc Leishman who closed with a 65.
- Shot a third-round 61 en route to a T3 at the World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship, his third career top-three result in WGCs. 61 included a hole-in-one on the par-3 17th, the second of his career.
- Claimed his fourth career PGA TOUR title at the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide which propelled him to No. 1 on the Official World Golf Ranking for the first time in his career. Extended his streak of consecutive seasons with a victory to four. Held a four-stroke lead entering the final round and improved to 1-for-3 converting the 54-hole lead/co-lead to victory. Under Rule 9.4, was assessed a General Penalty (two strokes) after a ball at rest moved on the par-3 16th in the final round, changing his score on the hole from a birdie to a bogey.
- After missing the cut at the Charles Schwab Challenge in the first Return to Golf event in June, he has made seven straight cuts and finished solo sixth at THE NORTHERN TRUST, the first event of the FedExCup Playoffs.
- Overcame a six-stroke deficit after 36 holes to claim his fifth PGA TOUR title and second of the season at the BMW Championship. Carded a final-round 64 and landed in a playoff with Dustin Johnson, whom he defeated on the first hole of sudden death after holing a birdie putt from 66 feet.
- Will be making his fourth consecutive appearance in the TOUR Championship, finishing T7 in 2017, T11 in 2018 and T12 last season. Has broken par on eight occasions in 12 career rounds at East Lake.

Justin Thomas – No. 3 (-7)

2019-20 season notes:

Wins: 3; THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES, Sentry Tournament of Champions, World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational

Starts: 17

Top-10s: 9

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Won THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES in his second start of the season; marked his second victory at the event and fourth in Asia since the start of the 2015-16 season

- Defeated Patrick Reed and Xander Schauffele in a playoff to win the Sentry Tournament of Champions for the second time.
- Finished T6 at the World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship. Held the 54-hole lead before shooting a final-round 73, falling to 4-for-7 for his career with the outright 54-hole lead and 0-for-2 at the event.
- Lost to Collin Morikawa in a playoff at the Workday Charity Open, his first runner-up of the season and fourth of his career. Made a 50-foot, 6-inch birdie putt on the first extra hole before falling to Morikawa with a bogey on the third hole. Held a two-stroke lead entering the final round after not making a bogey through three rounds.
- Won the World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational for the second time, earning his 13th PGA TOUR title and third of the season. At 27 years, 3 months, 4 days, became the third player since 1960 to win 13 times by that age, joining Jack Nicklaus and Tiger Woods.
- Held the FedExCup standings lead for 15 of 32 weeks during the 2019-20 season; took the standings lead into the 2019 TOUR Championship before finishing T3.

2019-20 season notes:

Wins: 2; Waste Management Phoenix Open, RBC Heritage

Starts: 13

Top-10s: 8

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Began the season with a T7 at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, marking his fourth top-10 in nine starts at the event.
- Fell to Tyler Duncan in a playoff at The RSM Classic, earning his second runner-up and fourth top-10 in his eighth start at the event. Held the first-round lead after opening with a 7-under 65.
- Continued his strong form into the new year with a solo third at the Sony Open in Hawaii and followed it up with his first victory of the season in his next start at the Waste Management Phoenix Open, where he birdied the final two holes and the first extra hole to defeat Tony Finau in a playoff. The win marked his sixth PGA TOUR title and first since THE PLAYERS 2018.
- Claimed the FedExCup standings lead for the first time since the 2013-14 season following his second win of the season at the RBC Heritage. Birdied five of his final seven holes to shoot a 64 and edge Abraham Ancer by one stroke.

Collin Morikawa – No. 5 (-5)

2019-20 season notes:

Wins: 2; Workday Charity Open, PGA Championship

Starts: 20

Top-10s: 6

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Held a two-stroke lead after the first round of the Sony Open in Hawaii before finishing T21. Marked his first 18-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR.
- Lost to Daniel Berger in a playoff at the Charles Schwab Challenge, earning his second career runner-up on the PGA TOUR in his 23rd career start. Missed putts inside six feet at the 72nd hole (5'9") and the playoff hole (3'0").
- Defeated Justin Thomas in a playoff to win the Workday Charity Open, collecting his second career PGA TOUR title in his 26th start. Became the first player since Tiger Woods in 1996 to win twice before missing two cuts as a professional. Overcame a three-stroke deficit entering the final round and made a 24-foot, 3-inch birdie putt on the first extra hole to extend the playoff before winning with a par on the third hole.
- Won his first major championship title in his PGA Championship debut and second start in a major. Marked his third PGA TOUR victory in his 29th career start. Became the fourth player since WWII to win the PGA Championship before turning 24, joining Jack Nicklaus, Tiger Woods and Rory McIlroy.
- Began the final round two strokes off the lead and before becoming the second PGA Champion to shoot 64 or better in the final round.

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Recorded three-consecutive top-10s prior to the suspension of the season in March due to the COVID-19 pandemic (T9, Waste Management; T5, AT&T Pebble Beach; T4, The Honda Classic)

- Won in the TOUR's return to competition at the Charles Schwab Challenge, where he edged Collin Morikawa on the first hole of sudden death to claim his third PGA TOUR title. Moved to No. 11 in the FedExCup standings, reaching that mark for the first time since the start of the 2017-18 season.
- Followed it up the next week with a T3 at the RBC Heritage, where he finished two back of Webb Simpson
- Earned his fifth top-five in a six-start stretch, finishing T2 at the World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational. Played the event for the first time since it moved to TPC Southwind, site of his first two wins on the PGA TOUR.
- Moved inside the top 5 of the FedExCup standings for the first time during the 2019-20 season after a solo-third result at THE NORTHERN TRUST. Recorded his seventh top-10 result of the season, a career best (6; 2015, 2016, 2017)
- Qualified for his third TOUR Championship and first since 2017

Best Finish: 2; THE NORTHERN TRUST

Starts: 19

Top-10s: 6

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Starting the year with Conditional status (126-150 in 2018-19 FedExCup standings), English jumped to a hot start in the season with four top-10 finishes in his first five events.
- His fifth top-10 came in the final event before the pandemic with a T9 at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard.
- Since the return to golf, and despite sitting out for a week after testing positive for COVID-19, English has made six of seven cuts, only missing narrowly in his first tournament back at Colonial, and his worst finish is T-23 at the Wyndham.
- He saved his best finish of the season for the Playoffs with a runner-up at THE NORTHERN TRUST guaranteeing the Georgia Bulldog will return to East Lake Golf Club and the TOUR Championship for the first time since 2015 and only the second time in his career.

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Picked up sixth PGA TOUR victory, winning the Rocket Mortgage Classic by three strokes over Matthew Wolff. The win moved him to No. 4 in the FedExCup standings and marked his seventh consecutive top-10 finish.
- Became the first TOUR winner to lead the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee and Strokes Gained: Putting in the ShotLink era.
- Became the only player with top-10 finishes in each of the first four events since the PGA TOUR's Return to Golf.
- Finished the regular season with a T4 at the PGA Championship. Posted a pair of 66s in the final two rounds to finish three back of winner Collin Morikawa.

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- In his 50th career start on the PGA TOUR, collected first career TOUR win at The Honda Classic with a one-stroke victory over Mackenzie Hughes. The victory moved Im to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings and cracked the top 25 in the Official World Golf Ranking for the first time.
- Following the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, moved to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings and remained the leader for a three-week stretch. Since victory at The Honda Classic, hasn't moved outside the top 10 in the FedExCup standings.
- Finished the regular season with a T9 at the Wyndham Championship. After a third-round 66, carded one eagle and five birdies to finish five back of winner Jim Herman.
- 2020 TOUR Championship marks Im's second consecutive appearance after qualifying as a rookie in 2019.

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Enjoyed strong performances during the Asian swing events last fall, finishing T3 in THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES in Korea, runner-up in the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP behind Tiger Woods in his home nation and T11 at the WGC-HSBC Champions in China.
- Produced back-to-back top-10s in February at The Genesis Invitational where he finished T5 with weekend rounds of 64-69 and T6 in the WGC-Mexico Championship.
- Will be making his seventh consecutive appearance in the TOUR Championship since his rookie season in 2014. His best finish in the FedExCup was eighth position in 2017 after he concluded the Regular Season as the No. 1 ranked golfer on the points list.
- Has three top-10 finishes at East Lake, with a career low round of 5-under 65 shot in the final round in 2018.
- Held a share of the 54-hole lead at the BMW Championship before carding a final-round 69 to finish T3.

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Earned one of the 25 PGA TOUR cards available through the Korn Ferry Tour Finals at No. 7 on the Finals points list to gain membership into the 2019-2020 PGA TOUR season.

- Won twice early in the season in back-to-back starts at the Bermuda Championship and the Mayakoba Golf Classic, returning from a slump that included losing permanent status on the PGA TOUR where he missed the cut 34 times in 36 events and fell outside the top 2,000 in the Official World Golf Ranking.
- Shot a final-round 62 to win the Bermuda Championship by four strokes over Harry Higgs, earning his second career PGA TOUR victory and first since the 2014 AT&T Byron Nelson. Made seven consecutive birdies in the final round, the longest such streak on TOUR since Kevin Chappell at 2019 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier (9).
- Won for the second consecutive week on the PGA TOUR schedule with a one-stroke win at the Mayakoba Golf Classic. Represented third career victory on TOUR. Became the first player since Bryson DeChambeau in 2017-18 to win back-to-back tournaments and the first since Xander Schauffele in 2018-19 to win back-to-back starts. Moved to No. 1 in the FedExCup for the first time in his career.
- Reaches the TOUR Championship for the second time in his career and the first since the 2014 season when he finished 27th in the standings.

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Reigning FedExCup champion finished no worse than T5 in first six starts of the season
- Won WGC-HSBC Champions for his 18th career PGA TOUR victory and third World Golf Championships title. The victory moved him to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings.
- Since victory at WGC-HSBC Champions, McIlroy hasn't moved out of the top 15 in the FedExCup standings.
- Finished the regular season with a T33 at PGA Championship at TPC Harding Park.
- Marks seventh trip, and third consecutive, to the TOUR Championship and is only one of two players to have won FedExCup title twice (Tiger Woods).
- Looking to become the first player to successfully defend his FedExCup title.

Patrick Reed – No. 13 (-3)

2019-20 season notes:

Wins: 1; WGC-Mexico Championship

Starts: 19

Top-10s: 7

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Claimed his eighth PGA TOUR victory at the WGC-Mexico Championship in February, his second WGC victory and second at the event. Closed with a 67 for a one-shot win over Bryson DeChambeau. Became the fifth player to win the WGC-Mexico Championship multiple times, joining Tiger Woods, Dustin Johnson, Ernie Els and Phil Mickelson.
- Lost to Justin Thomas in a three-hole playoff at the Sentry Tournament of Champions, falling to 2-2 for his career in playoffs. Marked his sixth career runner-up on TOUR and first since the 2018 Valspar Championship. Became the first player since the tournament moved to The Plantation Course at Kapalua in 1999 with 100 putts or fewer in a single year (99). One-Putt Percentage of 62.50 percent was the best on TOUR since Bud Cauley at the 2018 RBC Heritage (65.28%).
- Since the Return to Golf, has posted three top-10s: T7/Charles Schwab Challenge, T10 the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide, T9 Wyndham Championship.
- Will make his seventh consecutive appearance at the TOUR Championship where he has broken par in just six of 24 career rounds at East Lake Golf Club.
