Things to Know

- On the heels of three straight missed cuts, Wyndham Clark opens with career-low 10-under 61
- Billy Horschel makes a career-best 195'11" of putts, including two from over 40 feet, en route to a 63
- 2006, 2008 Waste Management Phoenix Open winner J.B. Holmes aces No. 4 en route to 64
- In first Waste Management Phoenix Open start, Scottsdale resident Nate Lashley opens with 66
- Following last week's runner-up finish at the Farmers Insurance Open, World No. 3 Jon Rahm shoots 67
- Defending champion Rickie Fowler bogeys five of first nine holes en route to a 3-over 74
- FedExCup points leader Justin Thomas shoots 68 in bid for third win of the 2019-20 PGA TOUR Season

- 4 First-round leaders/co-leaders of the Waste Management Phoenix Open since 2000 to convert for the win

Wyndham Clark (1st/-10)

- Made eight birdies in a 10-hole stretch (Nos. 12, 13, 15-17 and 1-3) en route to a career-low 61, one stroke shy of the 18-hole scoring record in the event (Phil Mickelson/R1/2013, Phil Mickelson/R2/2005 and Mark Calcavecchia/R2/2001)
- Previous low 18-hole score on the PGA TOUR was 64 from round three of the 2019 3M Open
- Ranks second in Strokes Gained: Tee To Green (5.365) and Strokes Gained: Putting (4.227)
- In his only previous start at the Waste Management Phoenix Open, missed the cut in 2018 (74-73)
- Takes an 18-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR for the second time. Was T1 at the 2017 Sanderson Farms
 Championship before finishing 17th
- Las Vegas resident has missed six cuts in eight starts this season, including each of his last three starts

- Finished T8 at THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES AND T46 at the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP
- In his rookie season on the PGA TOUR in 2018-19, collected three top-10 finishes on his way to a 64th-place finish in the FedExCup

Billy Horschel (2nd/-8)

- Highlighted by six birdies and an eagle at the par-5 third hole, opened with an 8-under 63
- Sank 195' 11" of putts, including four from over 25 feet. Of those, two were 45' 6" (No. 18) and 41' 0" (No. 4). Needed a total of 23 putts to complete his round
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (5.270)
- The 195' 11" total marks his most feet of putts made on the PGA TOUR (fourth overall at TPC Scottsdale)
- Hit eight of 14 fairways and 12 of 18 greens in regulation
- 2014 FedExCup champion is making his eighth consecutive start in the Waste Management Phoenix Open, with a T11 in his first start of 2013 his best showing
- In seven starts this season, has collected top-10 finishes at The ZOZO Championship (T6) and Mayakoba Golf Classic (T8)
- Seeks his sixth career PGA TOUR title and first since the 2018 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Scott Piercy). Last individual stroke-play title came at the 2017 AT&T Byron Nelson

J.B. Holmes (3rd/-7)

- Aced the par-3 fourth hole from 175 yards, two holes after succumbing to a double bogey at No. 2
- Marked the eighth hole-in-one at No. 4 at TPC Scottsdale
- Became fourth career hole-in-one on the PGA TOUR
- Also made an ace in the first round (sixth hole) of last season's Genesis Invitational, which he won
- 2006, 2008 Waste Management Phoenix Open winner looks to become the fifth player with at least three victories in the event (Phil Mickelson, Mark Calcavecchia, Gene Littler, Arnold Palmer)
- Making his 15th consecutive Waste Management Phoenix Open start
- Most recent of four top-10 finishes at TPC Scottsdale came in 2016 (T6)
- In four starts this season, best finish is T16 from last week's Farmers Insurance Open

Miscellaneous Notes

- 2005 University of Arizona grad and current Scottsdale resident **Nate Lashley (T8)** opened with a 5-under 66 in his first start in the Waste Management Phoenix Open
- A week removed from his runner-up finish at the Farmers Insurance Open, 2016 Arizona State University grad **Jon Rahm (T13)** opened with a 4-under 67 for the third straight year. In four starts, has not finished worse than T16 (2017)
- 2018 Waste Management Phoenix Open winner and reigning U.S. Open champion Gary Woodland (T47) opened with a 1-under 70
- Rickie Fowler (T110) made seven bogeys and four birdies to post a 3-over 74 in his bid to become the third player since 1970 to successfully defend his Waste Management Phoenix open title (Johnny Miller/1974-75, Hideki Matsuyama 2016-17). Dating to the Sony Open in Hawaii, no defending champion has made the cut in his title defense (Matt Kuchar/Sony Open in Hawaii, Adam Long/The American Express and Justin Rose/Farmers Insurance Open)
- Harold Varner III (T66) made 18 pars in round one
