Things to Know

- J.B. Holmes puts himself in position to capture a third Waste Management Phoenix Open title
- Wyndham Clark ties his best score to par through 36 holes on PGA TOUR
- Billy Horschel follows 195'11" of made putts in round one with 68' 0" in round two for 3-under 68
- Two-time Waste Management Phoenix Open runner-up Bubba Watson inside top 15 after 5-under 66 Friday
- Defending champion Rickie Fowler rallies after opening-round 74 with 6-under 65 Friday to make cut
- Harold Varner sets a PGA TOUR record by opening with 32 consecutive pars; misses cut

J.B. Holmes (1st/-13)

- 2006, 2008 Waste Management Phoenix Open winner eagled the par-4 17th hole (his eighth of the day) after his tee shot of 321 yards came to rest 6' 6" from the hole
- With five birdies, an eagle and a bogey, has played Nos. 15-18 in 6-under par through 36 holes
- Through 36 holes, is three-under par on TPC Scottsdale's front nine and 10-under on Nos. 10-18
- Takes a 36-hole lead/co-lead for the sixth time on the PGA TOUR. Of the previous five, the only one that resulted in victory was the 2008 Waste Management Phoenix Open
- Seeks to become the fifth player with at least three victories in the event (Phil Mickelson, Mark Calcavecchia, Gene Littler, Arnold Palmer)
- Making his 15th consecutive Waste Management Phoenix Open start
- Most recent of four top-10 finishes at TPC Scottsdale came in 2016 (T6)

In four starts this season, best finish is T16 from last week's Farmers Insurance Open

Wyndham Clark (2nd/-12)

- With 61-69—130 start, ties his best score to par through 36 holes (2019 The American Express/T18)
- Through 36 holes, is 4-under par on TPC Scottsdale's front nine and 8-under par on the inward nine
- In his only previous start at the Waste Management Phoenix Open, missed the cut in 2018 (74-73)
- Las Vegas resident has missed six cuts in eight starts this season, including each of his last three starts
- Finished T8 at THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES AND T46 at the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP
- In his rookie season on the PGA TOUR in 2018-19, collected three top-10 finishes on his way to a 64th-place finish in the FedExCup

Miscellaneous Notes

- 2014 FedExCup champion **Billy Horschel (T3/-11)** followed his 195' 11" of made putts in round one with 68' 0" en route to a 3-under 68 in round two after making eagle at the par-5 third hole for the second straight day
- Scott Piercy (5th/-10) aced the seventh hole from 194 yards using a 6-iron, his first on TOUR. He followed with a second eagle at the par-5 13th hole. Marks his seventh career round on the PGA TOUR with two eagles
- Defending champion Rickie Fowler (T40/-3) overcame a first-round 3-over 74 with 6-under 65 in his bid to become the third player since 1970 to successfully defend his Waste Management Phoenix open title (Johnny Miller/1974-75, Hideki Matsuyama 2016-17). Beginning on No. 10, made two eagles early at Nos. 13 and 15
- **Webb Simpson's (T8/-8)** 8-under 63 in round two marks his lowest score in relation to par since round three of the 2019 Masters, when he posted an 8-under 64 (T5)
- A week removed from his runner-up finish at the Farmers Insurance Open, 2016 Arizona State University grad **Jon Rahm (T12/-7)** followed a 4-under 67 in round one with a 68 in Friday's second round. In four starts, has not finished worse than T16 (2017)
- 2018 Waste Management Phoenix Open winner and reigning U.S. Open champion Gary Woodland (T25/-5)
 opened with scores of 70-67
- Harold Varner III (MC/E) began the week with 32 consecutive pars (TOUR record in the ShotLink era) before playing his last four holes, Nos. 15-18, without a par (birdie-bogey-birdie-bogey)
