Things to Know

- Defending champion Brooks Koepka ties his career-best score with a 62 to take the first-round lead
- Koepka becomes the first defending champion on TOUR to hold the 18-hole lead/co-lead since he led outright after the first round of the 2019 PGA Championship
- Rickie Fowler shoots his lowest first-round score since he opened with a 64 at the 2019 Waste Management Phoenix Open before going on to win
- Brendon Todd, one of three players with multiple wins in 2019-20, stands T2, tying career-best 18-hole position

- 5 First-round leaders/co-leaders to win the WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational (Stewart Cink/2004; Tiger Woods/1999, 2000, 2005; Adam Scott/2011)
- First-round leaders/co-leaders to win on PGA TOUR in 2019-20 (Most recent: Collin Morikawa/Workday Charity Open)

Brooks Koepka (1st/-8)

- Defending champion; earned seventh of seven PGA TOUR titles at the event in 2019
- Ties career-low 18-hole score with a 62 (second instance; first: R1/2016 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open/finished 2nd)
- Seventh 18-hole lead/co-lead of his PGA TOUR career; 1-for-6 in converting previous attempts to victory (won 2019 PGA Championship; other leads: 2015 FedEx St. Jude Classic, 2017 The Open Championship, 2017 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2019 Masters Tournament, 2019 TOUR Championship)

- Last defending champion on TOUR to hold the 18-hole lead/co-lead: Koepka, 2019 PGA Championship (went on to win wire-to-wire)
- Last player to successfully defend title on TOUR: Koepka, 2019 PGA Championship
- Last player to successfully defend title in a World Golf Championships event: Tiger Woods, 2007 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational
- Began the round with four consecutive birdies, the longest streak of his career to begin a tournament
- Front-nine 30 marks his lowest nine-hole score of the season
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green at 4.639, his best mark of the season in that category
- Entered the week No. 155 in the FedExCup standings with just three weeks remaining until the start of the FedExCup Playoffs; has not finished worse than 35th in the FedExCup since joining the PGA TOUR in 2014-15
- Will also defend title at next week's PGA Championship

Additional Player Notes

- **Rickie Fowler** (T2) opens with a 64, his fifth career first-round score of 64 or better and first since opening with a 64 before going on to win the 2019 Waste Management Phoenix Open
- **Brendon Todd** (T2) is one of three players with multiple wins during the 2019-20 season (Todd/2, Webb Simpson/2, Justin Thomas/2); ties his career-best 18-hole position at T2 (T46/2014 THE NORTHERN TRUST, Won/2019 Mayakoba Golf Classic)
- FedExCup leader and 2018 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational champion Justin Thomas opens with a 66 to stand T5
- Making his first start since winning the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide and moving to No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking, **Jon Rahm** (T36) opened with an even-par 70
