## Patrick Reed (1st/-18)

- Claims eighth PGA TOUR title, and his first since 2019 THE NORTHERN TRUST, in his 211<sup>th</sup> start at age 29 years, 6 months, 18 days
- With 550 FedExCup points for the win, moves to No. 5 in the FedExCup with 1,024 points, 379 points behind leader
  Justin Thomas; Has reached the TOUR Championship and finished in the top-30 of the FedExCup all but his first
  season on TOUR (54/2013, 21/2014, 12/2015, 3/2016, 22/2017, 22/2018, 9/2019)
- Has come from behind in three of eight TOUR victories (2015 Sentry TOC, 2016 THE NORTHERN TRUST, 2020 WGC-Mexico Championship)
- With the win, earns a spot in the field at the 2021 Sentry Tournament of Champions; Also earns 1,820 points towards making the 2020 U.S. Ryder Cup team and 550 points towards making the 2021 U.S. Presidents Cup team
- Won the 2014 WGC-Mexico Championship but had not recorded a top-10 in the tournament until Sunday's win
- With his second win at this event (2014), becomes the fifth multiple winner of this event (Tiger Woods/7 times, Dustin Johnson/3 times, Ernie Els/twice, Phil Mickelson/twice)

- Becomes 15<sup>th</sup> multiple winner of World Golf Championships events
- In three prior appearances at Club de Golf Chapultepec, finished T14/2019, T37/2018, T61/2017
- Prior to this win, recorded three top-10s in six starts this season including a runner-up at the Sentry Tournament of Champions where he fell in a playoff to Justin Thomas
- All four winners of the WGC-Mexico Championship at Club de Golf Chapultepec are American players (Patrick Reed/2020, Dustin Johnson/2019 & 2017, Phil Mickelson/2018)
- Required 98 putts for the week, the second time this season he has completed a tournament with less than 100 putts (Sentry Tournament of Champions/99 putts)

### Bryson DeChambeau (2<sup>nd</sup>/-17)

- Finished runner-up for the fourth time in his career while seeking his sixth PGA TOUR title, and first since 2018 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, in his 99<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR start
- Was attempting to extend his streak of winning at least one PGA TOUR event to four consecutive seasons
- Has now held the 36-hole lead/co-lead seven times without going on to win
- Finished T56 (2019) in his lone prior appearance at the WGC-Mexico Championship
- Best prior finish in five career World Golf Championships starts is a 30<sup>th</sup> at the 2018 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational

### Jon Rahm (T3/-15)

- Started the day four back and jumped into a tie for the lead at 15-under with four birdies in his first five holes; even-par back nine left him three back of the champion
- · Was seeking to become first player from Spain to win WGC-Mexico Championship and fifth international winner
- Matches best finish in nine World Golf Championships stroke-play events (T3/2017 WGC-Mexico Championship)
- Across the second, third and fourth rounds, tied the PGA TOUR record for most consecutive par-3 birdies or better with six (eight players)
- Equaled the best par-3 performance (8-under) in a World Golf Championships event (David Toms/2011 FedEx St. Jude Invitational, Richard Green/2008 FedEx St. Jude Invitational)
- Projected to climb to No. 2 in the Official World Golf Ranking

### Erik van Rooven (T3/-15)

- Posts T3 for best PGA TOUR finish while seeking his first TOUR win in his 10<sup>th</sup> start
- · Shared the lead at the turn but fell out of contention with a double bogey-birdie-bogey start to the back nine
- Sat 3-over through his first nine holes of the tournament and played the subsequent 63 holes in 18-under
- Required solo-second for PGA TOUR Special Temporary Membership
- Was attempting to become the second South African to win a World Golf Championships and first since Ernie Els (2004, 2010 WGC-Mexico Championship)
- Finished T36 in his lone prior start at the WGC-Mexico Championship in 2019

# **Miscellaneous Notes**

- Both Mexican players in the field finished inside the top 20, with Abraham Ancer (T12) and Carlos Ortiz (T16) each closing with 3-under 68; Previous best finish by a Mexican player at Chapultepec was T39 by Ancer in 2019; At the beginning of the week Ancer pledged \$100 per birdie and \$200 per eagle to the Casa de la Amistad para Ninos con Cancer. He notched 19 birdies for the week to contribute \$1,900 to the child cancer organization
- Rory McIlroy (5<sup>th</sup>/-14) recorded his eighth top-10 finish in the WGC-Mexico Championship, third-most behind Tiger Woods (13) and Sergio Garcia (9); Finish also marks his fifth top-5 in as many starts this season; Moves from No. 5 to No. 2 in the FedExCup; Has posted sub-70 scores in 14 of his last 16 rounds in WGC stroke-play events (dating to R1/2019 WGC-Mexico Championship); 60-under during this stretch
- Hideki Matsuyama (T6/-13) notched his 45<sup>th</sup> career top-10 finish in his 160<sup>th</sup> TOUR start; Only other top-10 results in WGC events were wins at the 2016 HSBC Champions and 2017 FedEx St. Jude Invitational, plus a T9/2015 Dell Technologies Match Play
- Tyrrell Hatton (T6/-13) won the 2019 Turkish Airlines Open on the European Tour then played one additional event before having wrist surgery; WGC-Mexico Championship marks first start since wrist surgery; Four top-20s in four appearances at WGC-Mexico Championship (T6/2020, T19/2019, T3/2018, 10<sup>th</sup>/2017); His two best finishes in 15 World Golf Championships starts have come at Chapultepec (T6/2020, T3/2018)
- Justin Thomas (T6/-13) headed into the final round with his 12<sup>th</sup> 54-hole lead/co-lead in his PGA TOUR career, having converted eight times (most recent: 2019 THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES); Has finished inside the top 10 in four starts at Club de Golf Chapultepec (T6/2020, 9<sup>th</sup>/2019, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2018, T5/2017); Retained his No. 1 position in the

FedExCup standings with a 320-point lead over Rory McIlroy; Was attempting to become the first FedExCup standings leader to win the WGC-Mexico Championship since 2007

- **Billy Horschel** (T9/-12) fires a final-round 65 to post a top-40 finish for the first time in five starts at the WGC-Mexico Championship
- Kevin Na (T9/-12) posts his best result since a playoff win at the 2019 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open
- Brandt Snedeker (T22/-5) posts final-round 64, his lowest round on TOUR since 63/R3/2019 THE NORTHERN TRUST
- Adam Scott (T26/-4), winner of last week's The Genesis Invitational, followed a first round 74 with 68-68-70
- After an opening-round 76, defending champion **Dustin Johnson** (T48/E) followed with 71-67-70
- Three international players (Ryan Fox/New Zealand, Cameron Smith/Australia, Byeong Hun An/South Korea) made eagle at the par-4 first hole in the final round; No. 1 surrendered 10 eagles for the week

- · Shared the lead at the turn but fell out of contention with a double bogey-birdie-bogey start to the back nine
- Sat 3-over through his first nine holes of the tournament and played the subsequent 63 holes in 18-under
- Required solo-second for PGA TOUR Special Temporary Membership
- Was attempting to become the second South African to win a World Golf Championships and first since Ernie Els (2004, 2010 WGC-Mexico Championship)
- Finished T36 in his lone prior start at the WGC-Mexico Championship in 2019

# **Miscellaneous Notes**

- Both Mexican players in the field finished inside the top 20, with Abraham Ancer (T12) and Carlos Ortiz (T16) each closing with 3-under 68; Previous best finish by a Mexican player at Chapultepec was T39 by Ancer in 2019; At the beginning of the week Ancer pledged \$100 per birdie and \$200 per eagle to the Casa de la Amistad para Ninos con Cancer. He notched 19 birdies for the week to contribute \$1,900 to the child cancer organization
- Rory McIlroy (5<sup>th</sup>/-14) recorded his eighth top-10 finish in the WGC-Mexico Championship, third-most behind Tiger Woods (13) and Sergio Garcia (9); Finish also marks his fifth top-5 in as many starts this season; Moves from No. 5 to No. 2 in the FedExCup; Has posted sub-70 scores in 14 of his last 16 rounds in WGC stroke-play events (dating to R1/2019 WGC-Mexico Championship); 60-under during this stretch
- Hideki Matsuyama (T6/-13) notched his 45<sup>th</sup> career top-10 finish in his 160<sup>th</sup> TOUR start; Only other top-10 results in WGC events were wins at the 2016 HSBC Champions and 2017 FedEx St. Jude Invitational, plus a T9/2015 Dell Technologies Match Play
- Tyrrell Hatton (T6/-13) won the 2019 Turkish Airlines Open on the European Tour then played one additional event before having wrist surgery; WGC-Mexico Championship marks first start since wrist surgery; Four top-20s in four appearances at WGC-Mexico Championship (T6/2020, T19/2019, T3/2018, 10<sup>th</sup>/2017); His two best finishes in 15 World Golf Championships starts have come at Chapultepec (T6/2020, T3/2018)
- Justin Thomas (T6/-13) headed into the final round with his 12<sup>th</sup> 54-hole lead/co-lead in his PGA TOUR career, having converted eight times (most recent: 2019 THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES); Has finished inside the top 10 in four starts at Club de Golf Chapultepec (T6/2020, 9<sup>th</sup>/2019, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2018, T5/2017); Retained his No. 1 position in the

FedExCup standings with a 320-point lead over Rory McIlroy; Was attempting to become the first FedExCup standings leader to win the WGC-Mexico Championship since 2007

- **Billy Horschel** (T9/-12) fires a final-round 65 to post a top-40 finish for the first time in five starts at the WGC-Mexico Championship
- Kevin Na (T9/-12) posts his best result since a playoff win at the 2019 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open
- Brandt Snedeker (T22/-5) posts final-round 64, his lowest round on TOUR since 63/R3/2019 THE NORTHERN TRUST
- Adam Scott (T26/-4), winner of last week's The Genesis Invitational, followed a first round 74 with 68-68-70
- After an opening-round 76, defending champion **Dustin Johnson** (T48/E) followed with 71-67-70
- Three international players (Ryan Fox/New Zealand, Cameron Smith/Australia, Byeong Hun An/South Korea) made eagle at the par-4 first hole in the final round; No. 1 surrendered 10 eagles for the week
- Of the 21 players making their WGC-Mexico Championship debut this week, eight are making their first start in a World Golf Championships event: Sebastian Muñoz (T14/-8), Carlos Ortiz (T16/-7), Scottie Scheffler (T26/-4), Lanto Griffin (T29/-3), Collin Morikawa (T42/-1), Zach Murray (T48/E), Lucas Herbert (T58/+4), Marcus Kinhult (T69/+13)
