ShotLink Keys to Victory for Dustin Johnson

Dustin Johnson won his 20th career PGA TOUR victory in his 246th career start. Johnson became the 38th player to reach 20 or more PGA TOUR victories. 22 of the 38 players to accomplish this feat have been under the age of 35. Dustin won his sixth World Golf Championships title and earned 550 FedExCup points moving from 57th to eighth in the standings.

Adam Scott

Adam Scott won his 14th career PGA TOUR title in his 325th TOUR start at the 2020 The Genesis Invitational. With his victory, Scott earned 500 FedExCup points and moved from 108th to 16th in the FedExCup standings, marking the biggest move in the standings last week (+92).

Scott ranked third in SG: Approach-the-Green, marking the fourth winner at this event to rank inside the top three in SG: Approach-the-Green in the ShotLink era.

In the Final Round, Adam Scott outperformed the field by +2.03 total strokes and made 51' 11" more of putts (109' 7") than in the first three rounds where Scott lost -0.41 strokes on the greens and averaged 57' 8" of putts made.
