

GLEN DAY (-6)

Q. How would you sum up your round today?

GLEN DAY: Very good, great start. I played good. I didn't hit the ball very well off the tee, but I putted really good even though I missed two very makeable putts on the last two. But I made one from the fairway from 80 yards or something for eagle, so that's not going to happen. But I still should have made one of these two. I played good, I played real solid. I doubt it's going to be leading. I have no idea, I haven't looked at the leaderboard.

Q. Tied for the lead at the moment.

GLEN DAY: Yeah, it won't be leading. So that's fine, I'm happy. It's the first day. I mean, got to do it all three days out here.

Q. The 80-yard shot was on 12, the par 5?

GLEN DAY: Yes.

Q. The eagle?

GLEN DAY: Yes.

Q. Do you remember what --

GLEN DAY: L wedge.

Q. L wedge. So you have not played particularly well --

GLEN DAY: No, never have.

Q. -- at this course. What did you find today?

GLEN DAY: Every year, every time I've come here all the time and every time I've come here I think, boy, this is a golf course for me, it fits my game, and I play like crap.

And today I started out, I wasn't hitting it good and I made a good par save on No. 2 of all things, which kind of made me feel good. I was making a bunch of pars.

It was tough out there. The front nine played tough, the pins were tucked, the wind was

blowing, you know. So a lot of pars, and slipped in one good putt, I was happy. And then actually the back nine to me is the harder nine, I played really good. It's a stupid game, it's a four letter word, what else can you say.

Q. How would you describe the state of your game coming into this week?

GLEN DAY: I've been playing really good for a long time, I've just had no confidence whatsoever. I just haven't had any confidence in my putting, you know. So hopefully this will propel me back to where I'm supposed to be.

Q. You said earlier that you don't think that your score's going to be leading at the end of the day.

GLEN DAY: No.

Q. Why don't you think that?

GLEN DAY: I don't think it's low enough, that's why. Somebody's going to beat it.

Q. How windy was it early on today?

GLEN DAY: It was blowing earlier and it kept shifting, it kept moving around. You'd play one hole, you get to the next hole and you think the wind was blowing one direction and it wasn't. So it was good, it was good.

Q. How would you sum up just what your overall experience on this tour has been like?

GLEN DAY: Oh, it's fabulous. You know, you get to go out and play with your friends. It's like playing golf with your friends. And then we're so competitive that we're actually playing in a tournament, you know. So it's all good, it's wonderful.

Q. You mentioned that you hadn't had confidence in your putting. Has that been kind of the one area where --

GLEN DAY: That's been the one area for about a year. Today I really did -- even though I missed the two putts on the last couple of holes, I hit them right where I wanted. It was really good and I felt comfortable with it, so it was good.

Q. Did you change anything mechanically?
