**Things to know**

- Justin and Mike Thomas become the fourth team to win the PNC Championship in their first start
- Team Thomas becomes the first team to win the PNC Championship with a father playing as partner
- Vijay and Qass Singh reel off nine straight birdies to finish second in 14<sup>th</sup> PNC Championship start
- Making their PNC Championship debut, Tiger and Charlie Woods post back-to-back 10-under 62s
- Defending champion Bernhard Langer finishes T12 at 17-under 127 with daughter, Jackie
- A member of each of the 20 teams held at least one major or PLAYERS Championship title

**Justin Thomas (Mike/Father) 119/-25**

- Making his PNC Championship debut, World No. 3 Justin Thomas and father, Mike, birdied 10 of their first 11 holes en route to a 15-under 57
- Birdies came at Nos. 1-7, 9-11, 13-16 and 18
- With the win, Team Thomas becomes the fourth to win in their first PNC Championship start; Raymond Floyd (1995), Stewart Cink (2013) and Angel Cabrera (2017)
- Team Thomas becomes the first team to win the PNC Championship with a father playing as partner
- With the win, the team collects \$200,000
- Justin Thomas is the winner of 13 PGA TOUR titles, including the 2017 PGA Championship

**Vijay Singh (Qass/Son) 120/-24**

- Following a par at the first hole, World Golf Hall of Fame member Vijay Singh, playing with son, Qass, made nine straight birdies on Nos. 2-10 en route to a second consecutive 12-under 60
- Team Singh was making a 14<sup>th</sup> start in the PNC Championship, dating to 2003
- In 13 previous starts before this week, T2s in 2006 and 2013 marked Team Singh’s best finish
- Singh is the winner of 34 PGA TOUR titles, including the 1998, 2004 PGA Championship and 2000 Masters Tournament

**Tiger Woods (Charlie/Son) 124/-20**

- Tiger Woods, 44, and 11-year-old son, Charlie, offset one bogey with eagles at Nos. 5 and 14 (both par-5s) and birdies at Nos. 3, 7, 10, 13, 16 and 18 to post a second consecutive 10-under 62
- Team Woods was one of four teams making their PNC Championship debut, joining Bubba Watson, Justin Thomas and Mark Calcavecchia

- Charlie Woods becomes the youngest to compete in PNC Championship history; Stefan Langer (12/2002), Javier Ballesteros (12/2002) and Thomas Lehman (12/2007)
- Woods is the winner of 82 PGA TOUR titles, including 15 major championship victories

#### Miscellaneous Notes

- **Lee Trevino**, 81, the only player to have competed in all 23 PNC Championships, followed birdies on 10 of his first 13 holes with an eagle at the par-5 14<sup>th</sup> en route to a 13-under 59 and tournament best T3 finish; Trevino was playing with son, Daniel
- Making his second start in the PNC Championship (T9/2018), 18-hole leaders **Matt Kuchar** and 13-year-old son, Cameron, shot an 8-under 64 Sunday to finish T5; Kuchar qualified for the 2020 PNC Championship by virtue of his 2012 PLAYERS Championship title, one of nine career PGA TOUR victories
- Making his first start in the PNC Championship, 2012 and 2014 Masters Tournament winner **Bubba Watson** and father-in-law Wayne Ball posted scores of 65-67—132 (-12)
- In his bid for a record-tying fifth PNC Championship title (Raymond Floyd), defending PNC Championship winner **Bernhard Langer** posted a final-round 8-under 64 to finish T12 at 17-under 127 playing with daughter, Jackie; was second a record-tying fifth PNC Championship title (Raymond Floyd)
- **Gary Player**, the oldest competitor in this week's PNC Championship field at 85, followed a 6-under 66 Saturday with a 9-under 63 in Sunday's final round to finish at 15-under 129 with grandson, James; Player was making his sixth start in the event
