ROUND 3 INTERVIEW September 20, 2020



JIM FURYK (-12, won first playoff hole)

Q. Well, congratulations. Second win in your second start out here. Can you just talk about the playoff today?

JIM FURYK: Yeah, I think Jerry and I both hit pretty solid tee shots and one thing I know about his game, Jerry's tough, he's a competitor and he's a great wedge player. So didn't surprise me at all when he hit that third shot and landed it right next to the stick. He had a little bit maybe more of a draw spin coming from the right side of the fairway. I was kind of coming from that left edge, maybe straight back more at it, but I knew it was going to be a fight and I knew I had to make birdie.

Q. Just tell us a little bit more about this shot right there in the playoff.

JIM FURYK: So, in regulation I had I think 81 yards to the pin and then in the playoff I had 82. I mean, I was almost identical. There's a lot less fog right now, blue sky. Because of the fog and the way it was and into the breeze, I felt like -- you know, what, it was 91 and 92 -- I felt like I had to kind of chip hold a gap wedge and hold it up against the breeze the first time. I hit it just the way I wanted to, was shocked when it hit, kind of kicked forward, didn't spin at all.

Coming in the second time being one yard farther, but we really felt because of the blue sky, the fog was gone, it was going to play a little bit shorter, I just felt it was a perfect like go-ahead-and-rip-it sand wedge where I could fly it to the hole, kind of keep it around the hole and just got a really good number, hit a nice shot.

Q. Was it nice to have the full team Furyk out here with Tabitha?

JIM FURYK: Yep, Tab's here. Tanner's not at the course, but we're all flying home together, so it will be a fun ride to fly home.

Q. Is a win at Pebble Beach a little extra special would you say?

JIM FURYK: It is. I think you always kind of earmark places that are special. I always felt like the course here suited my game. I felt like I've had some good events here, especially early in my career I had a bunch of top-5 finishes, not as much late. It's just an iconic golf course. It's one that you kind of want to put your name on and I can now say I won an event at Pebble Beach, so it's pretty cool.
