Things to Know

- This will be the 28th edition of the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by SYNNEX Corporation and the 13th year that Thornblade Club will serve as the primary host course; The Cliffs Valley will serve as the second course for the third tournament in a row and 10th instance overall; the tournament is one of two on the Korn Ferry Tour's 2020-21 schedule that is hosted by two courses and the only one played in 2021 (other: 2020 Country Club de Bogota Championship)
- The 2020 BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by the SYNNEX Corporation was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Russell Beiersdorf won the inaugural event in 1992 and has been followed through the years by many
 accomplished pros; other notable top finishers include 13-time PGA TOUR champion David Toms
 (champion in 1995), two-time Masters champion Bubba Watson (runner-up in 2003, tied with four-time
 TOUR champion Charley Hoffman) and two-time PGA TOUR champion Max Homa (champion in 2014)
- The BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by SYNNEX Corporation is a one-of-a-kind event on the Korn Ferry Tour that features celebrities and amateurs playing alongside professionals and is televised on Golf Channel
 - The 2021 tournament is highlighted by celebrities such as Canelo Alvarez, Anthony Anderson,
 Roger Clemens, Ken Griffey Jr. and Cedric the Entertainer

Field Notes (as of 6/7/21)

- Field headlined by six of the top 10, and 20 of the top 25 in the Korn Ferry Tour points standings
- No. 1 Stephan Jaeger, No. 2 Mito Pereira, No. 5 Davis Riley, No. 13 Cameron Young and No. 14 Jared
 Wolfe are all seeking a third win for immediate promotion to the PGA TOUR
- Four of the eight players who have already eclipsed 1,700 points which is the threshold the Korn Ferry
 Tour is currently using as its fail-safe number for players to finish inside of the top 25 of the 2020-21
 points standings and secure PGA TOUR cards are in this week's field: No. 1 Stephan Jaeger, No. 2 Mito
 Pereira, No. 3 Greyson Sigg, No. 5 Davis Riley
 - Pereira, Sigg and Riley will compete as rookies on TOUR beginning this fall, while Jaeger will begin his third TOUR season this fall, and No. 6 Will Zalatoris already has Special Temporary Membership on the PGA TOUR
- Field includes 60 past Korn Ferry Tour winners with 90 total wins, led by Stephan Jaeger and Martin Piller (six apiece)

- Field includes seven PGA TOUR winners with eight total victories, led by Sangmoon Bae with two
- 22 winners in the field from the current season: Hayden Buckley, Roberto Díaz, Brett Drewitt, Tommy Gainey, Evan Harmeling, Lee Hodges, Stephan Jaeger (x2), Kyle Jones, David Kocher, Curtis Luck, Max McGreevy, Trey Mullinax, Andrew Novak, Mito Pereira (x2), Seth Reeves, Davis Riley (x2), Greyson Sigg, Austin Smotherman, Curtis Thompson, Jared Wolfe (x2), Brandon Wu, Cameron Young (x2)

- For the second time in three years, the 2019 BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by SYNNEX Corporation was shortened to 54 holes due to inclement weather
- Australian Rhein Gibson fired three rounds of 66 or better in rainy conditions to claim his first Korn Ferry
 Tour title in his 105th career start; Gibson went on to finish 10th in The 25 to earn his PGA TOUR card that
 season
- After just two made cuts in his first 10 starts of the season entering the event, Michael Miller claimed the highest finish of his career at runner-up; Miller carded one bogey over 54 holes
- Entering the season with little status, Kris Ventura finished T3 to earn starts for the remainder of the season, which he parlayed into two wins en route to earning his TOUR card

Miscellaneous Notes

- Of the 25 past champions of the tournament (Shane Bertsch and Nick Flanagan each won twice), eight have gone on to win on the PGA TOUR, highlighted by Toms' 13 wins and Jonathan Byrd's five; other players with PGA TOUR wins and a win at the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by SYNNEX Corporation include Homa, Ken Duke, Rod Pampling, Ryuji Imada, Tom Scherrer and Chris Smith
- In 2019, the two courses used at the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by SYNNEX Corporation ranked as the two easiest courses on Tour in relation to par; the par-71 Thornblade Club played to an average of 68.566 (-2.434) while the par-72 The Cliffs Valley resulted in an average of 69.494 (-2.506)
- Eight players in the field played collegiately in South Carolina: one at the University of South Carolina (Sean Kelly), two at the University of South Carolina-Aiken (Matt Atkins, Roberto Diaz), two at Clemson University (Billy Kennerly, Carson Young), one at Wofford College (Andrew Novak), one at Winthrop University (Taylor Dickson) and one at Central Carolina Technical College (Tommy Gainey)
 - Novak, who starred at nearby Wofford College in Spartanburg, South Carolina, has made the cut in each of his first two starts at the tournament (T36/2018, T24/2019)
- The BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by SYNNEX Corporation is the 13th Korn Ferry Tour tournament of 2021 and 36th of the season

- Mito Pereira earned his second victory of the season in a playoff at last week's REX Hospital Open in Raleigh, North Carolina; Pereira edged Korn Ferry Tour points leader Stephan Jaeger as the latter bid for his third victory of the season and an immediate promotion to the PGA TOUR
- Pereira became the seventh player this season to cross the Korn Ferry Tour's fail-safe threshold of 1,700 points to ensure he would earn his PGA TOUR card through The 25 at the end of the summer; the win took him from 12th to second in the season-long points standings
- For Jaeger, the top-three finish was his sixth of the season in 29 starts, a total that includes finishes of two wins, three runners-up and one third
- The T3 finish by University of Arkansas alum Taylor Moore continued a hot stretch recently of nine consecutive top-25 finishes; over that time, Moore has collected six top-10s and risen from 70th to 20th in the points standings

Korn Ferry Tour 2020-21 Season

With the Korn Ferry Tour forming a combined 2020-21 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2021 BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by SYNNEX Corporation will be the 36th tournament (of 43) of the 2020-21 regular season.

Twenty-five PGA TOUR cards will be awarded to the top-25 players in the Korn Ferry Tour standings following the conclusion of the regular season at the Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Aetna (Aug. 12-15). Additionally, 25 PGA TOUR cards will be awarded through the three-event Korn Ferry Tour Finals at the conclusion of the 2021 Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance (Sept. 2-5).

With eight events remaining in the regular season, the Korn Ferry Tour is currently using the 1,700-point threshold as its fail-safe number for players to finish inside the top 25.
