Things to Know

- Field headlined by eight of the top-10 in Korn Ferry Tour standings
- After falling in a playoff two years ago, Justin Lower returns to the site of his career-best finish (2nd)
 - Lower matched that feat with a runner-up finish at The King & Bear Classic at World Golf Village last June
- Past champions in the field are Julian Etulain (2018), Kris Blanks (2014), Fabian Gomez (2010) and Steven Alker (2002)
- The Chitimacha Louisiana Open presented by MISTRAS is the second Korn Ferry Tour tournament of 2021 and 25th of the season

Field Notes (as of 3/15/21)

- 23 of the top-25 in the Korn Ferry Tour standings, led by No. 2 Taylor Pendrith and No. 3 Davis Riley
 - Riley and No. 7 Jared Wolfe are each seeking a third Korn Ferry Tour win for immediate promotion to PGA TOUR
- 60 past Korn Ferry Tour winners with 92 total victories, led by Martin Piller with six
- 12 PGA TOUR winners with 23 total victories, led by Robert Allenby and Aaron Baddeley with four each

- Vince Covello began the final round two strokes off the lead and recorded a 3-under 68, including a birdie on his 72nd hole after hitting his approach shot to one foot, to reach a playoff with Justin Lower
- Covello would go on to birdie the third playoff hole to clinch his first Korn Ferry Tour victory
- Lower had a two-shot lead (18-under) after 54 holes and was in position to win before Covello birdied two of his last three holes to force a playoff
- Covello's first career Korn Ferry Tour win came in his 80th Tour start at the age of 36 years, 3 months and 28 days
- Fabian Gomez carded a final-round 62 the low round of the week to rise to a T3 finish

Miscellaneous Notes

- **Justin Lower** is the top-returning finisher from the 2019 tournament and enters the week 29th in the Korn Ferry Tour points standings; Lower has finished runner-up, T3 (2018) and T20 (2016) in three previous starts at the event
- Louisiana State University alumni Andrew Loupe, Brandon Pierce and Curtis Thompson will each return
 to the state they competed in collegiately; Loupe is a Baton Rouge resident, while Pierce is from
 Covington
- Five of the top-10 finishers from the 2019 tournament will return to Le Triomphe this week (Justin Lower [2nd], Fabian Gomez [T3], Erik Barnes [T6], Greg Yates [9th] and Joshua Creel [T10])
- Eight qualifiers gained entry into the field at two sites on Monday, led by the medalists at each course, **Hayden Wood** (63/Links on the Bayou) and **Joseph Winslow** (63/OakWing Golf Club)
- Six-time PGA TOUR champion Jimmy Walker is the most accomplished former champion of the Chitimacha Louisiana Open presented by MISTRAS (2004); Walker became a major champion with a victory at the 2016 PGA Championship

- The Korn Ferry Tour last competed three weeks ago at Lakewood National Golf Club in Lakewood Ranch, Florida
- University of Missouri alum Hayden Buckley edged Dawson Armstrong and Taylor Montgomery with a birdie on the first playoff hole; Buckley was the last player in the field after getting in as an alternate 15 minutes before his tee time on Thursday morning
- Buckley's win came in his 17th start on the Korn Ferry Tour and led to his ascension from 85th to 27th in the Korn Ferry Tour standings
- **Billy Kennerly** held a three-stroke lead with four holes to go during the final round but went bogey-pardouble bogey-bogey over his final four holes to miss the playoff

Korn Ferry Tour 2020-21 Season

With the Korn Ferry Tour forming a combined 2020-21 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Chitimacha Louisiana Open presented by MISTRAS is uniquely in the middle of the season, even though it's the second event of the 2021 calendar year. After 23 events in 2020, the 2021 Chitimacha Louisiana Open is the 25th tournament (of 43) of the 2020-21 regular season. Twenty-five PGA TOUR cards will be awarded to the top-25 players in the Korn Ferry Tour standings following the conclusion of the regular season in August (following the Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Aetna). Additionally, 25 PGA TOUR cards will be awarded at the conclusion of the three-event Korn Ferry Tour Finals in August/September.
