







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

6am Weather Forecast

Today – A warmer and most likely dry day expected as temperatures climb into the upper 70s. A weak disturbance will move through Quebec, and this will lead to a substantial layer of cloud cover over Maine. Some showers and perhaps an isolated T-storm can't be completely ruled out after 4pm, but limited instability likely keeps development in check. Rain chances have been capped at 10%. Southerly winds will become blustery with gusts of around 20mph possible. **Sunrise: 5:00am / Sunset: 8:27pm**

Extended Forecast – There is a low chance for precipitation this evening, otherwise dry conditions are expected tonight. Fog development can't be ruled out again overnight, however with surface winds more southwesterly in nature, fog likely favors areas farther north along the coast. The sea breeze will have a harder time moving inland on Sunday and this likely leads to hot and dry conditions at the course. Wind gusts of 20-25 mph are possible as well. Even hotter conditions are expected on Monday with a slight chance for an afternoon T-storm.
