


Extended Forecast – A weak disturbance is expected to track through New England tonight and off the coast of Maine tomorrow morning. This will likely bring an increase in cloud cover and perhaps a few showers to the area Friday morning. The next concern will be Friday night and the potential for fog development as moisture levels increase. Right now, there is too much uncertainty to be confident in widespread dense fog. Upper-level ridging will expand and strengthen over the NW Atlantic this weekend and provide increasing warm and humid conditions. While a cold front will be situated to our northwest, any shower/T-storm development will likely remain closer to the front, with dry conditions for coastal Maine.
