Things to Know

- The Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Aetna is the 20th Korn Ferry Tour tournament of 2021, as well as the 43rd and final event of the 2020-21 combined regular season
 - 25 PGA TOUR cards will be awarded to the top 25 players in the Korn Ferry Tour's regular season points standings following the conclusion of this week's final round
- While this is the fifth iteration of the Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Aetna, which debuted in 2017, it is the first time the tournament will serve as the final regular season event where The 25 is finalized and players receive their PGA TOUR cards
- GOLF Channel will have live telecast coverage from 6-8 p.m. ET all four rounds, and the PGA TOUR Card
 Ceremony will be streamed live via Korn Ferry Tour social media accounts at 8:15 p.m. ET following
 Sunday's final round
- 19 players have crossed the 1,600-point threshold the Korn Ferry Tour is currently using as its fail-safe number for players to finish inside the top 25, leaving six PGA TOUR cards up for grabs this week
- Players ranked 21st through 27th in the points standings are within 93 points of each other, while players ranked 24th through 27th are separated by 18 points
- Additionally, the top-75 players in the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour points standings at the conclusion of this
 week's final round will earn spots in the three-event Korn Ferry Tour Finals and retain full status on the Korn
 Ferry Tour for the 2022 season
 - o Players ranked 73rd through 80th are within 97 points of each other
- Cameron Young, who ranks 18th in the points standings and has secured a PGA TOUR card, Monday qualified into the 2020 Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Aetna for his first career Korn Ferry Tour start, finished T11, and proceeded to finish T14, T6, and T2 in the next three events en route to Special Temporary Membership; he won back-to-back tournaments this past May
- Defending champion Seth Reeves, who sits 17th in the points standings and finished T5 last week to cross the 1,600-point threshold and secure a return to the PGA TOUR, is not in the field; he and his wife, Patricia, had their first child this week
- The 2018 champion David Skinns is in the field and ranks 46th in the points standings
- The Club at Indian Creek has hosted every edition of the Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Aetna
- The Korn Ferry Tour previously hosted the Cox Classic presented by Lexus of Omaha from 1996-2013

- Field headlined by eight of the top 10, and 22 of the top 25 in the Korn Ferry Tour points standings, including points standings leader **Stephan Jaeger**
- Field includes 60 past Korn Ferry Tour winners with 90 total wins, led by **Stephan Jaeger** and **Martin Piller** with six apiece
- Field includes two PGA TOUR winners Derek Ernst and Tommy Gainey
- 30 winners in the field from the current season: Tyson Alexander, Paul Barjon, Hayden Buckley, Joshua Creel, Roberto Díaz, Brett Drewitt, Tommy Gainey, Harry Hall, Evan Harmeling, Lee Hodges, Stephan Jaeger (x2), David Kocher, David Lipsky, Curtis Luck, Max McGreevy, Taylor Moore, Trey Mullinax, Andrew Novak, Chad Ramey, Davis Riley (x2), Tag Ridings, Greyson Sigg, Austin Smotherman, Adam Svensson, Curtis Thompson, Peter Uihlein, Jared Wolfe (x2), Brandon Wu, Dylan Wu, Cameron Young (x2)

With the Korn Ferry Tour forming a combined 2020-21 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2021 Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Aetna will be the 43rd and final tournament of the 2020-21 regular season. Twenty-five PGA TOUR cards will be awarded to the top-25 players in the Korn Ferry Tour standings following the conclusion of the final round.

Additionally, the top-75 players in the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour points standings at the conclusion of this week's final round will earn spots in the three-event Korn Ferry Tour Finals, where another 25 PGA TOUR cards will be awarded at the conclusion of the 2021 Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance (Sept. 2-5).

- Seth Reeves carded a final-round 7-under 64 more than two hours before the final groups concluded play for his first Korn Ferry Tour victory
- After the third round, Reeves stood eight strokes off the lead and in T27 position
 - Reeves' eight-stroke come-from-behind victory was the largest deficit overcome in a win since
 Peter Tomasulo's win from eight strokes back at the 2010 Ford Wayne Gretzky Classic presented
 by Samsung
 - o Reeves remains the only winner this season who stood lower than T10 after the third round
- Reeves played his final 15 holes at 8-under par and shot a 5-under 30 on the back nine, highlighted by an eagle at the par-5 15th and a birdie at the par-4 18th
- Rookie Ryan Ruffels held the 54-hole lead but settled for a T2, which remains his only top-10 this season
- **Tyson Alexander**'s T2 marked the highest Korn Ferry Tour finish of his career until he won the 2021 Veritex Bank Championship in April
- **Taylor Pendrith**'s T2 marked his third consecutive runner-up finish, and he added a fourth runner-up finish a month later with a solo second at the 2020 Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics
- Nick Voke's T2 remains the only top-five of his Korn Ferry Tour career

- Oakridge Country Club hosted the Utah Championship presented by Zions Bank in Farmington, Utah last week
- **Joshua Creel** earned his first career Korn Ferry Tour victory, clinching the win with a 30-foot birdie putt on the 72nd hole
- Creel moved from 64th to 32nd in the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour points standings
- **Taylor Montgomery** and **Peter Uihlein** both climbed five spots and into the top 25 of the Korn Ferry Tour points standings, moving to 24th and 25th, respectively
- Montgomery logged his fourth top-three finish of the 2020-21 season, while Uihlein posted his third top-two finish of the season which includes a win at the 2021 MGM Resorts Championship at Paiute
- **Hayden Buckley** tied the course record with a final-round 10-under 61 and moved onto The 25 bubble with his first top-five since winning the 2021 LECOM Suncoast Classic
 - Buckley tied the course record shared by Cameron Champ, Andres Gonzales, Jacques Blaauw, and Christian Brand
- Seth Reeves (T5 / -20) and **Andrew Novak** (T8 / -19) both eclipsed the 1,650-point threshold the Korn Ferry Tour used through last week as its fail-safe number for players to finish inside the top 25 if the 2020-21 points standings and earn a PGA TOUR card for this fall
 - Novak earned his TOUR card for the first time, while Reeves previously earned his TOUR card for the 2019 season with a 14th-place finish in the 2018 Korn Ferry Tour Finals
