## Things to Know

- The Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics is one of the four original tournaments from 1990 still on the Korn Ferry Tour schedule, and this year marks the 32nd playing of the event
- This will be the event's 20th consecutive year at Crestview Country Club
- Two of the most notable past champions of the Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics are David Duval and Tom Lehman, who were both ranked No. 1 in the world during their careers and won the 2001 and 1996 Open Championship, respectively
  - o Lehman won the inaugural Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics, and Duval won in 1993
- Major championship winners David Toms (1995) and Jason Dufner (2001) also won in Wichita; Toms went on to win the 2001 PGA Championship, while Dufner won the 2013 PGA Championship
- Aaron Wise broke scoring records in his 2017 win in Wichita, then garnered 2018 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year honors the following year
- Defending champion **Jared Wolfe** is in the field and will attempt to become the first player in the Korn Ferry Tour's 32-year history to successfully defend his title
- Wolfe is one of five players with multiple wins during the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour season, which is the most multi-time winners in a single Tour season since 2012
- Last week, Mito Pereira won for a second conseucitive week and for the third time this season, earning
  him a Three-Victory Promotion to the PGA TOUR; he will have PGA TOUR membership for the remainder
  of the 2021 season (as well as eligibility for the FedExCup Playoffs, should he earn enough points to
  qualify) and the entire 2022 PGA TOUR season
  - Pereira became the 12th player in Korn Ferry Tour history and the first since Wesley Bryan (2016)
     to earn a Three-Victory Promotion
- Prior to the last four weeks which saw both Cameron Young and Pereira record back-to-back wins the last player to win back-to-back events was Michael Putnam in 2013
  - Young and Pereira were the 10th and 11th players, respectively, in Korn Ferry Tour history to win back-to-back events
    - Jason Gore remains the only player in Korn Ferry Tour history to post back-to-back wins on multiple occasions, doing so in both 2002 and 2005
- With a T26 finish last week, Lee Hodges eclipsed the 1,700-point threshold the Korn Ferry Tour is currently
  using as its fail-safe number for players to finish inside top 25 of the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour points
  standings and secure a PGA TOUR card for this fall; he became the ninth player to cross the threshold

- Field headlined by 12 of the top 25 in the Korn Ferry Tour points standings, led by No. 10 Chad Ramey
- No. 16 Jared Wolfe is seeking a third win for immediate promotion to the PGA TOUR
- Field includes 50 past Korn Ferry Tour winners with 75 total wins, led by Martin Piller with six
- Field includes three PGA TOUR winners with six total victories, led by **Sean O'Hair** with four

- Jared Wolfe carried a three-stroke lead into the final round and outlasted the field on a windy Sunday afternoon for his second win of the 2020-21 season
- Wolfe bogeyed the opening hole of his final round, made 12 consecutive pars thereafter, and ended that streak with an eagle at the par-5 14th which gave him a three-stroke lead with four holes to play
- Taylor Pendrith had a 15-footer for birdie on the 72nd hole to force a playoff, but his putt slid by and Wolfe converted an up-and-down par and won by a single stroke
- Wolfe was the first player in the tournament's history to shoot over par in the final round (he carded a 1-over 71) and still win
- Wolfe's opening-round 7-under 63 tied the lowest score of his Korn Ferry Tour career, as he previously shot a 9-under 63 in the third round of the 2020 The King & Bear Classic at World Golf Village
- **Dawson Armstrong**'s T3 was, at the time, the highest finish of his Korn Ferry Tour career; he went on to finish T2 at the 2021 LECOM Suncoast Classic this past February
- Brad Hopfinger's T3 remains the highest finish of his Korn Ferry Tour career

- **Brad Hopfinger** played the 2007-08 season at the University of Kansas before he transferred to University of Iowa; he led the Jayhawks in scoring average and finished T7 at the 2008 Big 12 Championship
- Max McGreevy's father, Brian McGreevy, played golf at University of Kansas, earning letters from 1985-88
- Eight qualifiers gained entry into the field at two sites Monday, led by Sand Creek Station Golf Course
  medalist Charlie Hillier, a University of Kansas alum, and Auburn Hills Golf Course medalist Quade
  Cummins, who finished No. 6 in the inaugural PGA TOUR University Ranking List to earn Forme Tour status
- The Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics is the 14th Korn Ferry Tour tournament of 2021 and 37th of the season

- Thornblade Club (primary course) and The Cliffs Valley hosted the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by SYNNEX Corporation in Greer, South Carolina last week
- Mito Pereira joined Jason Gore (2005), Pat Bates (2001), and Chris Smith (1997) as the only players in Korn Ferry Tour history to win back-to-back events and earn a Three-Victory Promotion in the same season

- Justin Lower finished solo second for the third time in his career and second time this season; his previous runner-up finishes came at the 2019 Chitimacha Louisiana Open presented by MISTRAS, and the 2020 The King & Bear Classic at World Golf Village
- Lower's runner-up finish took him from 37th to 23rd in the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour points standings
- Max McGreevy posted his fourth top-three finish of the 2020-21 season, and his first since a solo second
  at the 2021 Club Car Championship at The Landings Club this past March; he won the 2020 Price Cutter
  Charity Championship presented by Dr Pepper earlier this season
- **Nick Hardy** notched a T5 for his third consecutive top-five, the longest streak of his Korn Ferry Tour career; he has five top-10s in his last seven starts
- **Stuart Macdonald** finished T5 for his second consecutive top-five, third consecutive top-10, and fourth top-10 in his last five starts
- Prior to a T7 at the Visit Knoxville Open five starts ago, Macdonald was ranked 117th in the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour points standings; he moved to 61st with last week's T5
- Austin Eckroat (7th), Kevin Yu (T20), and Garett Reband (MC) made their Korn Ferry Tour debuts after finishing Nos. 3-5 in the inaugural PGA TOUR University Ranking List, which granted them exemptions into all remaining open, full-field Korn Ferry Tour events for the remainder of the 2020-21 season

### Korn Ferry Tour 2020-21 Season

With the Korn Ferry Tour forming a combined 2020-21 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2021 Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics will be the 37th tournament (of 43) of the 2020-21 regular season.

Twenty-five PGA TOUR cards will be awarded to the top-25 players in the Korn Ferry Tour standings following the conclusion of the regular season at the Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Aetna (Aug. 12-15). Additionally, 25 PGA TOUR cards will be awarded through the three-event Korn Ferry Tour Finals at the conclusion of the 2021 Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance (Sept. 2-5).

With seven events remaining in the regular season, the Korn Ferry Tour is currently using the 1,700-point threshold as its fail-safe number for players to finish inside the top 25.
