Things to Know

- Sacramento native Cameron Champ picks up his third PGA TOUR victory in his 76th start; moves to No. 49 in the FedExCup
- Champ joins Collin Morikawa, Jon Rahm and Bryson DeChambeau as players aged 27 or younger to win in each of the last three seasons on TOUR
- · Of Louis Oosthuizen's 12 runner-up finishes on TOUR, four have come in his last seven starts
- Jhonattan Vegas picks up the third runner-up finish of his career, with all coming this season
- Charl Schwartzel records his fifth runner-up finish (second this season)
- Following Cameron Tringale's T16 finish, PGA Championship winner Phil Mickelson remains the only 54-hole leader/coleader to win in the last 13 TOUR events
- Past 3M Open champion Matthew Wolff and Michael Thompson both finish T39

Cameron Champ (1st/-15)

- Picks up his third PGA TOUR victory in his 76th start at the age of 26 years, 1 month, 10 days
- Has won in three consecutive seasons: 2018 Sanderson Farms Championship, 2019 Fortinet Championship, 2021 3M Open
- Joins Collin Morikawa, Jon Rahm and Bryson DeChambeau as players 27 or younger to win in each of the last three seasons
- Collects 500 points and moves from No. 142 to No. 49 in the FedExCup standings
- Career finishes in the FedExCup: 62nd (2019), 24th (2020)
- Records the 12th come-from-behind win in the last 13 PGA TOUR events (Phil Mickelson/PGA Championship)
- Becomes the first come-from-behind winner of the 3M Open
- Wins in his second start at the 3M Open (MC/2019)
- Only other top-10 finish this season came at the ZOZO Championship (T8)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (+8.480)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Louis Oosthuizen (T2) picks up his fifth top-3 finish in his last seven starts on TOUR: 2nd (Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with teammate Charl Schwartzel), T8 (Valspar Championship), T2 (PGA Championship), T18 (the Memorial Tournament), 2nd (U.S. Open), T3 (The Open Championship), T2 (3M Open); four of his 12 runner-up finishes have come during that stretch
- In search of his fourth PGA TOUR victory and first since the 2017 RBC Canadian Open, **Jhonattan Vegas** (T2) records the third runner-up finish of his career, with all coming this season (2nd/Puerto Rico Open, T2/Palmetto Championship at Congaree, T2/3M Open)
- Charl Schwartzel (T2) posts his second top-three finish in as many starts at the 3M Open (T3/2020, T2/2021); marks his second runner-up finish of the season (Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with teammate Louis Oosthuizen) and fifth of career
- One day after opening with seven consecutive birdies on Nos. 10-16, **Keith Mitchell** (5th) carded a bogey-free 4-under 67 to snap a streak of five-consecutive missed cuts; scoring breakdown this week (+2/front nine, -14/back nine)
- Mito Pereira (T6) earns his second-consecutive top-10 finish (T5/Barbasol Championship)
- After entering the week with missed cuts in his last three TOUR starts, Adam Hadwin (T6) now has top-10 finishes in both starts at the 3M Open (4th/2019, T6/2021)
- Following a 3-over 74, **Cameron Tringale** (T16) becomes the first 54-hole leader/co-leader at the 3M Open who failed to win; falls to 0-for-2 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead (2019 John Deere Classic/T16)
- 2021 Rocket Mortgage Classic winner Cam Davis (T28) turned in the round of the day with a bogey-free 7-under 64
- Bo Hoag (T16) carded a 1-under 70 on his 33rd birthday
- One day after earning a spot on the U.S. Olympic Team, Patrick Reed (T34) closed with an even-par 71
- Past 3M Open champions: Matthew Wolff (T39) and Michael Thompson (T39)
