Things to Know

- Bryson DeChambeau wins eighth career PGA TOUR title, becomes first player to win multiple events during the 2020-21 season
- With the win, DeChambeau moves to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the second time this season (ninth week
- DeChambeau is the first American to win the Arnold Palmer Invitational since 2015 (Matt Every)
- Lee Westwood collects seventh runner-up finish on TOUR and best finish at this event in 14 starts
- Jordan Spieth earns third top-five finish in last four starts on TOUR

- Wins eighth PGA TOUR title in his 117th TOUR start at the age of 27 years, 5 months, 19 days
- Eighth TOUR win since the start of the 2016-17 season marks third most wins on TOUR in that time (most: 12, Dustin Johnson and Justin Thomas)
- With the win, moves to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the second time and ninth week this season
- Becomes the first player to win multiple titles during the 2020-21 season (2021 U.S. Open); ties the longest streak to start a season since 1994 (Nick Price won his second tournament in the 21st week of the season)
- Third top-five in five starts at the event (2nd/2018, 4th/2020, Won/2021)
- Marks seventh player to win both the Memorial Tournament and Arnold Palmer Invitational
- Becomes second player in ShotLink era (2003-present) to lead the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (+1.761 per round) and go onto win (Francesco Molinari/2019)

- One of two players since 1983 to lead the field in Driving Distance (321.3 yards) and win the event (2018/Rory McIlroy/316.5 yards)
- Of a total 7,352 drives hit on No. 6 in ShotLink era (2003-present), owns the three longest drives on that hole (370, 377 and 360 yards); two of which recorded this week (370 and 377 yards)
- Made a par putt of 49 feet, 9 inches on No. 11, his longest putt made in his career at Bay Hill
- Becomes the first American to win the Arnold Palmer Invitational since 2015 (Matt Every); previous five winners: Tyrrell Hatton, Francesco Molinari, Rory McIlroy, Marc Leishman, Jason Day

Miscellaneous Notes

- 54-hole leader Lee Westwood collects seventh runner-up finish on TOUR and best finish at this event in 14 starts;
 was looking to capture first TOUR victory since 2010 FedEx St. Jude Classic to become second-oldest player to win on TOUR in the 2020-21 season
- **Jordan Spieth** finishes T4, earning his third top-five in his last four starts on TOUR (T4/Waste Management Phoenix Open, T3/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T4/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard); current streak of 389 holes without a double bogey or worse marks longest streak in his career on TOUR
- **Corey Conners** held the 18-hole co-lead and 36-hole lead before finishing 3rd, earning his best finish of the 2020-21 season (previous: T8/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP @ SHERWOOD)
- PGA TOUR Special Temporary Member **Will Zalatoris** finished T10, his ninth top-25 in 12 starts on TOUR during the 2020-21 season
- Despite bookend 77s in his title defense, **Tyrrell Hatton** finishes T21
- With a top-10 finish, non-member **Christiaan Bezuidenhout** (7th/-5) is now eligible for The Honda Classic (the next open PGA TOUR event)
- Kristoffer Ventura (T36/+2) carded a hole-in-one, the first of his PGA TOUR career, at the par-3 14th from 202 yards; Mastercard will donate an additional \$200,000 to the Arnold & Winnie Palmer Foundation in honor of the hole-in-one
