*36-hole cut: 67 professionals at 1-under 143 from a field of 156 professionals. Note: Because the amateur portion of the tournament was canceled for 2021, the cut rule was changed from low 60 and ties to standard PGA TOUR rule of low 65 and ties. This had no effect on the cut made.*

**Things to Know**

- Jordan Spieth holds a one-stroke lead, his first 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR since 2017 THE NORTHERN TRUST
- Spieth is 6-for-11 in his PGA TOUR career with the 36-hole lead/co-lead, including 1-for-2 at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Daniel Berger records TOUR-leading 24<sup>th</sup> consecutive par-or-better score
- 18-hole leader Patrick Cantlay records 1-over 73 at Spyglass Hill after tying Pebble Beach course record in the first round
- Phil Mickelson shoots an 80, his highest score on the PGA TOUR since the 2018 U.S. Open and 10<sup>th</sup> career score of 80 or higher

- Winner of the 2017 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Lowest 36-hole score on TOUR since the 2020 Charles Schwab Challenge (130; finished T10)
- Coming off a T4 at last week's Waste Management Phoenix Open, his best finish on TOUR since the 2019 PGA Championship (T3)
- In search of first PGA TOUR victory since 2017 The Open Championship

#### Daniel Berger (2<sup>nd</sup>/-11)

- Records 24<sup>th</sup> consecutive score of par or better, the longest active streak on TOUR; had a streak of 32 such rounds during the 2019-20 season (ended: R1/2020 the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide)
- One bogey through 36 holes (fewest in the field)
- No. 15 in the Official World Golf Ranking, the second-highest of any player in the field (Cantlay, No. 11)
- Two top-10s in two prior starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T10/2015, T5/2020)
- Earned third PGA TOUR title at the 2020 Charles Schwab Challenge, the PGA TOUR's first tournament back from a three-month hiatus due to COVID-19

- **Phil Mickelson's** 80 is his highest score on the PGA TOUR since the 2018 U.S. Open (81/R3) and his 10<sup>th</sup> career score of 80 or higher on the PGA TOUR

- After tying the course record at Pebble Beach with a first-round 62, **Patrick Cantlay** (T4/-9) records a 1-over 73 at Spyglass Hill; Cantlay entered the week as the highest-ranked player in the field in both the FedExCup standings (No. 3) and Official World Golf Ranking (No. 11)
- Defending champion **Nick Taylor** stands T25 after rounds of 69 (PB) and 71 (SH); last player to successfully defend title at AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am: Dustin Johnson, 2010
- Making his PGA TOUR debut, sponsor exemption **Kamau Johnson** recorded scores of 81 (SH) and 77 (PB) to miss the cut; Johnson received a sponsor exemption for next month's The Honda Classic
