Things to Know

- Jordan Spieth is the first player since Dustin Johnson (2020) to hold the 54-hole lead/co-lead in consecutive weeks
- Spieth is 9-of-17 on TOUR with the 54-hole lead/co-lead, including 1-for-1 at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Despite a double bogey on final hole, Daniel Berger records TOUR-leading 25th consecutive par-or-better score
- Max Homa becomes just the seventh player since 1983 to birdie all four par-3s at Pebble Beach Golf Links
- Despite seven top-six finishes in 11 prior starts, Jason Day seeks first AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am victory
- Defending champion Nick Taylor sits T34 and nine strokes behind Spieth

- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for the second straight week (Waste Management Phoenix Open/T4); last player to perform the feat was Dustin Johnson in 2020 (all three FedExCup Playoffs events)
- 9-for-17 in his PGA TOUR career with the 54-hole lead/co-lead, including 1-for-1 at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am

- Holed out for eagle with an 8-iron from 160 yards on the par-4 16th hole; during the first round, holed out for an eagle-2 from 113 yards at No. 10; just the 36th player in the Shotlink era to have two or more hole-outs in an event over 100 yards (two at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am since 2003: Blake Adams/2010, Spieth/2021)
- Winner of the 2017 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am; has four top-10 finishes in eight previous starts at the event
- T4 at last week's Waste Management Phoenix Open, his best finish since the 2019 PGA Championship (T3)
- In search of first PGA TOUR victory since 2017 The Open Championship
- His 385-yard drive on the par-4 ninth hole was his longest drive of the season (T14 longest of career)

Daniel Berger (T2/-11)

- Records 25th consecutive score of par or better, the longest active streak on TOUR; had a streak of 32 such rounds during the 2019-20 season (ended: R1/2020 the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide)
- Posted even-par 72, including a double bogey on the par-5 18th hole
- Drove the par-4 fourth hole and made an 8-foot, 8-inch eagle putt; became just the second player out of 4,309 tee shots at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (through the conclusion of the third round) to successfully drive the green on No. 4 (Davis Love III/2012/15' 2")
- No. 15 in the Official World Golf Ranking, the second-highest of any player in the field (Cantlay, No. 11)
- Two top-10s in two prior starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T10/2015, T5/2020)
- Earned third PGA TOUR title at the 2020 Charles Schwab Challenge, the PGA TOUR's first tournament back from a three-month hiatus due to COVID-19

Additional Player Notes

- **Nate Lashley** (T2/-11) bogeyed his final two holes to post a 4-under 68; seeking second PGA TOUR victory in his 71st start (2019 Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- **Tom Hoge** (T2/-11) opened with a 6-under 30 (his lowest nine-hole score at Pebble Beach) en route to a 4-under 68; has played the front nine this week in 12-under (no bogeys) vs. the back nine in 1-over (five bogeys/one double bogey); seeking first TOUR win in his 170th start (best finish: 2/2019 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier)
- **Russell Knox** (T2/-11) turned in a bogey-free 3-under 69; fourth-most bogey-free rounds on TOUR since 2013 (Charles Howell III/71, Patrick Reed/57, Kevin Na/54, Knox/53); is making his 111th start since the most recent of his two PGA TOUR wins (2016 Travelers Championship)
- **Patrick Cantlay** (T2/-11) entered the week as the highest-ranked player in the field in both the FedExCup standings (No. 3) and Official World Golf Ranking (No. 11); week highlighted by tying the course record at Pebble Beach with a first-round 62
- In search of first TOUR win since the 2018 Wells Fargo Championship, **Jason Day** (T7/-10) trails by three as he seeks his fifth straight top-five finish at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am; has nine top-15 finishes in 11 starts at the event
- Stanford University product **Maverick McNealy** (T7/-10) was assessed a one-stroke penalty on the fifth hole after it was deemed he caused his ball to move; went on to post a 3-under 69 to sit three strokes behind Spieth

- University of California-Berkeley graduate **Max Homa** (T11/-9) became just the seventh player since 1983 to birdie all four par-3s at Pebble Beach Golf Links (most recent: Chad Collins/R3/2011)
- Defending champion **Nick Taylor** is T34 in bid to become first player to successfully defend title at AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am since Dustin Johnson in 2010
- **Francesco Molinari** (T53/-1) was assessed a two-stroke penalty on the second hole when his caddie stood on an extension of his line of play directly behind him (Rule 10.2b/4); went on to post a 4-over 76
