**Things to Know**

- Daniel Berger makes a 30-foot, 7-inch eagle putt at the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole to win the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am by two strokes
- Berger earns his fourth PGA TOUR title and first since the 2020 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Berger records 26<sup>th</sup> consecutive score of par or better, the longest active streak on TOUR
- Patrick Cantlay (T3) moves to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings
- Jordan Spieth (T3) posts back-to-back top-fives on TOUR for the first time since 2018

- Earns fourth PGA TOUR title and first since the 2020 Charles Schwab Challenge (PGA TOUR's first event back from a three-month hiatus due to COVID-19)

- Makes 30-foot, 7-inch eagle putt at the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole, his longest made putt of the week, to defeat Maverick McNealy by two strokes
- Made four eagles in four rounds for the first time in his PGA TOUR career (No. 6/PB/R2, No. 4/PB/R3, No. 2/PB/R4, No. 18/PB/R4); fourth player on record (since 1983) to do so at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, joining Willie Wood/1990, Mike Weir/2001, Nick Taylor/2017

- Records 26<sup>th</sup> consecutive score of par or better, the longest active streak on TOUR; had a streak of 32 such rounds during the 2019-20 season (ended: R1/2020 the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide)
- Wins the week after former Florida State teammate Brooks Koepka, who won last week's Waste Management Phoenix Open; in 2017, Berger won the FedEx St. Jude Classic and Koepka won the U.S. Open the following week
- Moves to No. 13 in the Official World Golf Ranking; entered the week as the second-highest ranked player in the field at No. 15 (highest: Patrick Cantlay, No. 11)
- Third top-10 in three starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T10/2015, T5/2020, Won/2021)

#### Additional Player Notes

- **Maverick McNealy** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-16) has two top-fives in 50 career starts on the PGA TOUR: T5/2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2021 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- **Jordan Spieth** (T3/-15) finishes in the top five in consecutive weeks on TOUR for the first time since 2018 (T3/Vivint Houston Open, 3<sup>rd</sup>/Masters Tournament); Spieth, who is now 6-for-12 with the 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and 9-for-18 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead, now has five top-10s in nine starts at the event
- **Patrick Cantlay** (T3/-15) moves to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings; now has a win (ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP @ SHERWOOD), a runner-up (The American Express) and a T3 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am) on the season
- **Nate Lashley** (T5/-14) dropped out of a share of the lead after a four-putt triple-bogey from 12 feet, 10 inches at No. 16; Lashley was leading the field in Strokes Gained: Putting prior to the 16<sup>th</sup> hole
- Defending champion **Nick Taylor** finished T39
