Things to Know

- Making his 114th PGA TOUR start, Adam Schenk would become the event's sixth straight first-time winner
- Schenk's only other lead after a round on TOUR came at the 2020 Barracuda Championship (R1/finished T12)
- Andrew Putnam would become the 13th player to record his first two PGA TOUR victories at the same event
- Four past Barracuda Championship winners are inside the top 20 (Putnam, Scott Piercy, Greg Chalmers, Gary Woodland)
- Erik van Rooyen would become the first player to win in Barracuda Championship debut since Collin Morikawa (2019)
- Joel Dahmen trails by five points in bid to become the seventh multiple winner of the season
- Making his 208th start since his last win on TOUR, Sean O'Hair turns in the round of the day with 17 points

Scoring

The Barracuda Championship is employing the Modified Stableford scoring format, the first PGA TOUR event to use the format since The International in 2006. Players are allocated points based on the number of strokes taken at each hole with the goal of achieving the highest overall score.

Adam Schenk (+38/1st)

- Seeking first PGA TOUR victory in 114th start; the last five winners of the Barracuda Championship have been first-time winners (TOUR's longest active streak)
- Only other lead after a round on TOUR came at the 2020 Barracuda Championship (R1/finished T12)
- Best finish on TOUR came at the 2021 John Deere Classic (T4)
- Making third appearance at Barracuda Championship (MC/2018, T12/2020)
- Sits No. 113 in FedExCup while seeking to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs for the third consecutive season

Additional Notes

- **Andrew Putnam** (+34/T2) would become the 13th player to record his first two PGA TOUR victories at the same event (Vaughn Taylor also performed the feat at the Barracuda Championship in 2004-05); 2018 winner would join Taylor and J.J. Henry as multiple winners of the Barracuda Championship
- **Erik van Rooyen** (+34/T2) trails by four points after a 10-point performance in the third round; the last player to win in his Barracuda Championship debut was Collin Morikawa (2019)
- Making his first start at the Barracuda Championship since winning the event in 2011, **Scott Piercy** (+33/T4) seeks to join Vaughn Taylor and J.J. Henry as multiple winners of the Barracuda Championship
- 18-hole leader **Joel Dahmen** (+33/T4) leads the field in birdies (21); with a win would become the seventh multiple winner of the season (2021 Corales Puntacana Championship)
- Second-round leader **Emiliano Grillo** (+31/6th) is in search of his third top-20 finish at the tournament (T18/2019, T9/2020); ranks No. 42 in the FedExCup standings, highest ranked player in the field
- Two-time Mackenzie Tour-PGA TOUR Canada winner and current Korn Ferry Tour member **Taylor Pendrith** (+30/7th) trails by eight points; most recently finished T11 at the Barbasol Championship
- Making his tournament debut, **Sean O'Hair** (+29/T8) is making his 208th start since his last win at the 2011 RBC Canadian Open; turned in the round of the day with 17 points
- Current position of the five past champions who advanced to the weekend: **Andrew Putnam** (T2), **Scott Piercy** (T4), **Greg Chalmers** (T11), **Gary Woodland** (T16), **Richy Werenski** (T42)
