Things to Know

- World No. 1 and defending BMW Championship winner Jon Rahm holds a share of the 18-hole lead for the second consecutive week
- 2012 BMW Championship winner Rory McIlroy ties his lowest score of the season (64/R4/Waste Management Phoenix Open)
- In his BMW Championship debut, Sam Burns posts a 64 for the fourth time in his last eight rounds on the PGA TOUR
- The top 30 players in the FedExCup at the conclusion of the BMW Championship will advance to the season-ending TOUR Championship
- Current projections of players to move <u>into</u> top 30: Sergio Garcia, Keegan Bradley
- Current projections of players to move outside top 30: Charley Hoffman, Max Homa

First-Round Lead Notes

- 8 First-round leaders/co-leaders since 2000 at the BMW Championship to go on to win (most recent: Justin Thomas/2019)
- 5 First-round leaders/co-leaders to win on PGA TOUR in 2020-21 (most recent: Matt Jones/The Honda Classic)

Jon Rahm (T1/-8)

- World No. 1 and defending champion holds the 18-hole lead/co-lead for the second straight week on TOUR; the last player to hold at least a share of the 18-hole lead in consecutive weeks was Justin Thomas (2019 BMW Championship, TOUR Championship)
- Becomes the third defending champion to hold the 18-hole lead/co-lead this season: Justin Thomas/Sentry Tournament of Champions, Sebastian Munoz/Sanderson Farms Championship

- Six-time PGA TOUR winner, including the 2021 U.S. Open; has never successfully defended a title
- Eighth career 18-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 1-for-7 to date converting to victory (2018 The American Express)
- Bogey-free 64 included 28 putts for a total of 117'10" of putts
- Last four starts on the PGA TOUR: WD/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (led by six strokes after 54 holes and was forced to withdraw), Won/U.S. Open, T3/The Open Championship, 3/THE NORTHERN TRUST
- One career win in the FedExCup Playoffs (2020 BMW Championship)
- Leads the PGA TOUR in top-10 finishes this season with 13

Rory McIlroy (T1/-8)

- 2012 BMW Championship winner made seven birdies and an eagle at the par-5 16th to offset one bogey (par-3 13th)
- In addition to his 2012 victory, finished inside the top-10 in 2014/T8, 2015/T4 and 2018/5th
- Needed 25 putts to sink 106'2" total feet of putts
- Since claiming his 19th career TOUR title at the Wells Fargo Championship, has one top-10 finish (T7/U.S. Open)
- Two-time FedExCup champion has five FedExCup Playoffs titles, second only to Dustin Johnson (6)

Sam Burns (T1/-8)

- In his BMW Championship debut, made four consecutive birdies on Nos. 11-14 en route to his fourth round of 64 in his last eight rounds on the PGA TOUR
- Takes his 12th lead/co-lead after any round on the PGA TOUR this season, the most of any player
- Is 0-for-1 in converting 18-hole leads/co-leads (2021 The Genesis Invitational/T3)
- Is one of four players who qualified for the BMW Championship for the first time in their careers (others: Cam Davis, K.H. Lee, Erik van Rooyen)
- Claimed his first career TOUR title in May at the Valspar Championship
- Followed a playoff loss at the World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational three weeks ago with a T21 at last week's THE NORTHERN TRUST

Miscellaneous Player Notes

- Following four straight birdies on Nos. 3-6, **Sergio Garcia** (4th/-7) birdied two of his last three holes to open with a 7-under 65 in his 11th BMW Championship and first since 2017 (T12); Garcia is No. 44 in the FedExCup as he seeks a return to the TOUR Championship for the first time since 2017
- Following bogeys on two of his first six holes, **Patrick Cantlay** made a career-best five consecutive birdies on Nos. 12-16 en route to a back-nine 30, tying his career-low score on the back nine (three times)
- Making his fourth start in the BMW Championship, **Abraham Ancer** made seven birdies against one bogey en route to a 6-under 66 (T5); highlighted by his first career PGA TOUR win at the WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational, five of his seven top-10 finishes this season have come in his last nine TOUR starts
- 2010 and 2016 BMW Championship winner Dustin Johnson (T7/-5) offset one bogey with six birdies in his 12th BMW Championship start; comes off a runner-up finish in last year's event at Olympia Fields Country Club
- Following last week's victory at THE NORTHERN TRUST, FedExCup leader **Tony Finau** sits T7 at 5-under 67; with six birdies, a bogey and a double bogey, his only par on the inward nine came at the par-4 18th hole
- World Golf Hall of Fame Member and 45-time PGA TOUR winner **Phil Mickelson** opened with a 4-under 68 (T19) in his 23rd BMW Championship; best of two top-10 finishes is T2 (2012); began the week as the last man in the field at No. 70 in the FedExCup
