Weather: Mostly cloudy. High of 80. Wind NE 6-12 mph. Due to heavy rain and lightning, the second round was suspended from 1:49 – 4:15 p.m. CT (2 hours, 26 minutes).

Things to Know

- Jordan Spieth holds his 13th second-round lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR (6-for-12 to date)
- Spieth is the only player bogey-free through 36 holes
- In just his fourth TOUR event since the conclusion of the 2015-16 season, Erik Compton is T6
- 2000, 2008 Charles Schwab Challenge winner Phil Mickelson misses the cut

- 11 Second-round leaders/co-leaders at the Charles Schwab Challenge to win (since 1990)

- 8 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win on PGA TOUR in 2020-21

Jordan Spieth (1st/-11)

- Playing his 34th round at Charles Schwab Challenge, followed an opening-round 63 with 4-under 66
- Holds his 13th second-round lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR; 6-for-12 to date converting to victory
- Matches low 36-hole score on TOUR:129 (2016 AT&T Byron Nelson/T18)
- Marks 18th round inside the top-four of the leaderboard since the Waste Management Phoenix Open, most on TOUR

- Seeks his 13th title and second of the season (Valero Texas Open)
- 2016 Charles Schwab Challenge winner cards fifth bogey-free score at the tournament; only player bogey-free through 36 holes
- With a win this week, could overtake the No. 1 spot in the FedExCup

Jason Kokrak (2nd/-10)

- Posts second-consecutive 65 to move to 10-under; marks the second time in his PGA TOUR career to shoot back-to-back rounds of 65 or better (129/2018 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier/T3)
- Picked up his first PGA TOUR victory earlier this season at the THE CJ CUP @ SHADOW CREEK
- Trying to become the third player with multiple titles during the 2020-21 season, joining Bryson DeChambeau (U.S. Open, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard) and Stewart Cink (Fortinet Championship, RBC Heritage)
- Finished T3 in 2020 for his best finish in six appearances at the Charles Schwab Challenge

Additional Player Notes

- **Sergio Garcia** (T3/-8) is seeking to add to his 2001 title and become the tournament's 13th multiple winner
- **Sebastián Muñoz** (T3/-8) missed the cut last year in his only other start at the Charles Schwab Challenge: opened (Nos. 10-12) and closed (Nos. 16-18) his back nine with three consecutive birdies
- **Patton Kizzire** (T3/-8) is coming off a solo third at the AT&T Byron Nelson two weeks ago, his best finish on TOUR since winning the 2018 Sony Open in Hawaii
- **Charley Hoffman** (T6/-7) follows 71 with the low round through 36-holes, 8-under 62, for a nine-stroke turnaround
- Two-time heart transplant recipient and sponsor exemption, **Erik Compton** (T6/-7) follows 65 with a 2-under 68; marks his first made cut since the 2016 Quicken Loans National (T29)
- Defending champion **Daniel Berger** is T16 at 4-under
- **Joaquin Niemann** posts his TOUR-leading 20th consecutive made cut
- Winner of last week's PGA Championship and two-time winner of the Charles Schwab Challenge (2000, 2008), **Phil Mickelson** misses the cut following rounds of 73-69 (+2)
- **Scott Piercy** was disqualified for signing an incorrect scorecard
- **Si Woo Kim** withdrew during the second round (back injury)
