#### Things to Know

- After equaling his low 54-hole score on the PGA TOUR, Jordan Spieth holds the third-round lead/co-lead for the 20<sup>th</sup> time, including his fourth of the season (tied with Sam Burns for most of the season)
- Spieth would supplant Ben Hogan as the youngest player to record his second victory at the event
- Top three players on the leaderboard vying to become the third multiple winner of the season
- 20 years after winning the Charles Schwab Challenge for the first of his 11 PGA TOUR wins, Sergio Garcia is in search of his second win at Colonial Country Club

#### Jordan Spieth (1st/-15)

- With a win this week, could overtake the No. 1 spot in the FedExCup
- Equals his low 54-hole score on TOUR: 195 (2016 Sentry Tournament of Champions/won, 2021 Waste Management Phoenix Open/T4, 2021 Charles Schwab Challenge/TBD)
- Victory on Sunday would come in his 208<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR start at the age of 27 years, 10 months, 3 days; would supplant a 34-year-old Ben Hogan as the youngest to win his second Charles Schwab Challenge title
- Seeks his 13<sup>th</sup> title and second of the season (Valero Texas Open); would join Bryson DeChambeau and Stewart Cink as multiple winners this season

- 2016 Charles Schwab Challenge champion would become the event's 13<sup>th</sup> multiple winner; would become the second event he has won twice (2013, 2015 John Deere Classic)
- Played the first 40 holes this week without a bogey until the par-4 fifth hole in the third round
- Marks TOUR-leading 19<sup>th</sup> round inside the top-four of the leaderboard since the Waste Management Phoenix Open
- Fourth 54-hole lead/co-lead of the season (tied with Sam Burns for most on TOUR): Waste Management Phoenix Open/T4, AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/T3, Valero Texas Open/won, Charles Schwab Challenge/TBD
- 20<sup>th</sup> career 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR; 10-for-19 to date converting to victory

#### Jason Kokrak (2<sup>nd</sup>/-14)

- At 14-under 196, posts his low 54-hole score on TOUR (198/2019 Wyndham Championship/T6)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (+9.590) and Driving Distance (322.6 yards)
- Seeks second TOUR win (2020 THE CJ CUP @ SHADOW CREEK) in his 249<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 36 years, 7 days
- Would join Bryson DeChambeau and Stewart Cink as multiple winners this season
- Finished T3 in 2020 for his best finish in six appearances at the Charles Schwab Challenge

#### Additional Player Notes

- **Sergio Garcia** (3<sup>rd</sup>/-10) is seeking to win 20 years after claiming the first of his 11 PGA TOUR titles at the 2001 Charles Schwab Challenge (current longest gap between victories at the event is 13 years: Ben Crenshaw/1977-1990); leads the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (+4.920) and Scrambling (T1; 16/18)
- **Ian Poulter** (T4/-8) cards 6-under 64, his best score in 29 rounds at the Charles Schwab Challenge; in search of first win on the PGA TOUR since the 2018 Vivint Houston Open
- **Sebastián Muñoz** (T4/-8) missed the cut last year in his only other start at the Charles Schwab Challenge: in search of his second PGA TOUR victory (2019 Sanderson Farms Championship) in his 94<sup>th</sup> start
- Two-time heart transplant recipient and sponsor exemption, **Erik Compton** (T6/-7) earned his best finish among 163 TOUR starts at the 2014 U.S. Open, finishing runner-up to runaway winner Martin Kaymer
- With seven top-10 finishes, 2019 Charles Schwab Challenge runner-up **Tony Finau** (T9/-6) trails only Jon Rahm (10) for the most on TOUR this season (note: Jordan Spieth also has seven top-10s this season)
- At T34, defending champion **Daniel Berger** trails Spieth by 13 strokes
