Things to Know

- Jason Kokrak overcomes final-round deficit to become the third multiple winner of the season
- Kokrak becomes the first player over the age of 35 to claim his first two PGA TOUR victories in the same season since Francesco Molinari in 2018
- 54-hole leader Jordan Spieth bogeys three of his first four holes and two of his last four to finish second
- Patton Kizzire claims a second consecutive T3 finish this season, with both coming in the Dallas/Ft. Worth area
- Highlighted by an 8-under 62 in round two, Charley Hoffman claims a second top-5 finish in Texas this season
- Ian Poulter starts with 14 straight pars before closing with a 2-under 68 to claim his 51st top-10 finish on TOUR

Jason Kokrak (1st/-14)

- After posting his low 54-hole score on TOUR (14-under 196), made five birdies and five bogeys to post an even-par 70 and claim his second career PGA TOUR title and second this season (2020 THE CJ CUP @ SHADOW CREEK)
- Began the day trailing Dallas, Texas native Jordan Spieth by a stroke; becomes the 10th player among the last 13 winners of the event to come from behind in the final round
- Victory comes in his 249th TOUR start at the age of 36 years, 8 days
- Becomes the first player over the age of 35 to claim his first two TOUR titles in same season since Francesco Molinari in 2018 (35)
- Eighteen of the last 20 winners of the Charles Schwab Challenge have been over the age of 30
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and moves from 27th to No. 5 in the standings
- With his victory, is projected to move inside the top 25 in the Official World Golf Ranking

- Only previous top-10 finish in six previous Charles Schwab Challenge appearances was T3 in 2020
- Marks his fifth top-10 finish of the season, tying his record for most (2019)
- Joins Bryson DeChambeau and Stewart Cink as multiple winners this season

Jordan Spieth (2nd/-12)

- Taking a one-stroke lead into the final round, made three consecutive bogeys on Nos. 2-4 and two additional bogeys on Nos. 15 and 18 before closing with a 3-over 73
- Dallas native was seeking his 13th career PGA TOUR title, second at the Charles Schwab Challenge (2016) and second this season (Valero Texas Open)
- The finish marks his 14th career runner-up in 208 TOUR starts
- Marks his eighth top-10 finish of the season (18 starts), which is one more than he achieved in the last two seasons combined; is his sixth top-5 finish since the 2021 Waste Management Phoenix Open
- 2015 FedExCup champion moves to No. 2 in the standings
- Is now 10-for-20 when attempting to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR

Additional Player Notes

- Between first- and third-round over-par scores, **Charley Hoffman** (T3/-10) posted a second-round 8-under 62; closed with a 5-under 65 to pick up his second top-10 finish in his 13th Charles Schwab Challenge start (T10/2015)
- After missing the cut in his first Charles Schwab Challenge start in 2020, **Sebastian Munoz** (T3/-10) closed with a 2-under 68 to claim his third top-10 finish of the season and first since the Valero Texas Open in San Antonio (T9)
- **Patton Kizzire** (T3/-10) offset three bogeys with six birdies en route to a 3-under 67; also finished T3 in his most recent start on TOUR at the AT&T Byron Nelson in Dallas two weeks ago
- **Ian Poulter** (T3/-10) started the final round with 14 straight pars before finishing birdie-bogey-birdie-birdie in his eighth start in the event; marks his third top-10 finish at Colonial Country Club (T5/2015, 8th/2009)
- Looking to claim a second Charles Schwab Challenge title 20 years after his first in 2001, **Sergio Garcia** (T20/-4) was 3-over through his first three holes before closing with a 6-over 76 to tie his highest score in 32 rounds in the event (R1/2002)
- Defending champion **Daniel Berger** finished T20 at 4-under 276
- If not otherwise exempt, top-10 finishers this week earn invitations to the Travelers Championship
