Things to Know

- Austria's Sepp Straka holds first-round lead/co-lead for third time in his PGA TOUR career
- Scott Harrington and Tyler McCumber hold a lead/co-lead for the first time after any round on TOUR
- Scott Harrington shares the Corales Course record of 62 (Korn Ferry Tour event)
- Hudson Swafford is the only PGA TOUR winner of the six players at 6-under or better
- Three of the four co-leaders record eagles at the par-5 4th hole (Hudson Swafford)
- Kelly Kraft finishes eagle-par-eagle, including an ace at his final hole
- Last time four players shared first-round lead was 2020 THE NORTHERN TRUST at TPC Boston

First-Round Lead Notes

- At this event in 2018, Brice Garnett held the first-round lead with 63 (-9) and led wire-to-wire for his first TOUR victory
- In 2019 at this event three players (Matt Jones, Joel Dahmen, Paul Dunne) shared the first-round lead with 66 (-6)

Player Notes

Sepp Straka (T1/65)

- Hit 11 of 14 fairways, 13 of 18 greens and needed 25 putts en route to bogey-free 7-under 65
- Highlight was eagle at par-5 4th (his 13th hole), hitting 5-wood to five feet and converting the putt
- Second appearance at this event; sat T5 and four back at 11-under thru 54 holes in 2019 en route to T26 after final-round 74
- Held two previous first-round leads/co-leads, finishing T46 both times (2018 Safeway Open, 2019 Valspar Championship)
- Opened this season with T14 at Safeway Open with four under-par rounds
- Former University of Georgia Bulldog is first Austrian-born PGA TOUR member
- Best result among four top-10s in 51 previous starts on TOUR 3rd/2019 Barbasol Championship
- Advanced to the FedExCup Playoffs in each season as TOUR member (2019/No. 115, 2020/No. 79); currently 34th
- Also played Korn Ferry Tour event at this venue in 2017 (MC/73-71); won 2018 KC Golf Classic on Korn Ferry Tour

Scott Harrington (T1/65)

- Makes an eagle, six birdies and a bogey in his first appearance at the Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship
- Shares the Corales Course record of 62 (-10), which he shot in the second round of the 2016 Korn Ferry Tour event played at this venue (shares with Stephan Jaeger and Alex Rocha)
- Holds a lead/co-lead for the first time after any round on the PGA TOUR
- Finished T36 at season-opening Safeway Open with four under-par rounds
- Posted top-25 finishes in three of his first four starts as a PGA TOUR rookie last season (T24/A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier, MC/Sanderson Farms Championship, T23/Safeway Open, T2 Houston Open)
- T2 at 2019 Houston Open marks best result in 27 PGA TOUR starts
- One of eight rookies to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in the 2019-20 season, ending at No. 98 in the FedExCup standings
- Ranked T1 in Driving Accuracy hitting 14 of 14 fairways

Hudson Swafford (T1/65)

- Played the back nine in 5-under 31 en route to 7-under 65 and a share of the lead
- Required just 23 putts, the fewest of any player in the first round
- Holds first-round lead/co-lead for third time on TOUR (2014 Mayakoba Golf Classic/T51, 2017 RBC Canadian Open/T32); also opened with 65s in each of the first two occasions
- Missed the cut with 74-71 in 2019 at his only previous start in this event
- Began this season with a T56 at the Safeway Open
- Seeks second TOUR victory after capturing 2017 The American Express

Tyler McCumber (T1/65)

- Shoots 7-under 65 to match his low round on TOUR (65/R1/2020 Travelers Championship); holds lead/co-lead for the first time
 after any round on TOUR
- PGA TOUR debut came at this event in 2018; sat third through 54 holes before final-round 75 led to T19 finish, his best result among four top-25s in 23 TOUR starts
- Former Florida Gator is the son of 10-time PGA TOUR winner Mark McCumber
- Turned professional in 2013 and owns three victories on PGA TOUR Latinoamerica
- Won three times on the Mackenzie Tour-PGA TOUR Canada in 2018, ending that year No. 1 on the Order of Merit, earning 2019
 Korn Ferry Tour membership and Mackenzie Tour Player of the Year honors
- Finished No. 161 in the FedExCup as a PGA TOUR rookie last season

Miscellaneous Notes

- Xinjun Zhang (T5/66) also posted opening-round 66 in the 2018 Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship, finishing T5
- **Joseph Bramlett** (T5/66) misses matching his career low round on TOUR by one stroke (65, twice) while making his 50th start on TOUR but first at this event
- **Kelly Kraft** (T17/68) finished eagle-par-eagle, including an ace at his final hole with an 8-iron from 183 yards; ace was fourth in tournament history with previous three coming at No. 17 in 2018
- Mackenzie Hughes (T17/68) the only player in the field to reach the 2020 TOUR Championship, finished T2 at this event in 2019
- After a T6 at last week's U.S. Open, Will Zalatoris sits T46 after a 2-under 70, along with defending champion Graeme McDowell,
 World No. 43 Henrik Stenson, and Puntacana Resort ambassador Emiliano Grillo
