Things to Know

- Sam Burns holds a one-stroke lead, the first 54-hole lead/co-lead of his PGA TOUR career
- Burns leads the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee and SG: Tee to Green
- Each player in the top five is either in search of first PGA TOUR victory (Burns, Ortiz, Straka) or has won at least 10 times on TOUR (Day, Johnson)
- 12-time PGA TOUR winner and former World No. 1 Jason Day seeks first victory since 2018 Wells Fargo Championship
- World No. 1 Dustin Johnson recorded his second consecutive 66; only player in the field with a round of 66 or better in both the second and third rounds

Third-Round Lead Notes

- Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Vivint Houston Open since 2000 (includes each of the last two: Ian Poulter/2018, Lanto Griffin/2019)
- Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win in 2020-21 (Sergio Garcia/Sanderson Farms Championship; Martin Laird/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open)

Sam Burns (1st/-9)

• First career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; third career lead after any round, with all three coming during the 2020-21 season (R2/Safeway Open/finished T7, R2/Vivint Houston Open, R3/Vivint Houston Open)

- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (3.881) and Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (12.753); entered the week No. 5 on TOUR in SG: Off the Tee but No. 73 in SG: Tee to Green
- Career-best finish is a T3 at the 2018 Sanderson Farms Championship
- Has one top-10 in four starts during the 2020-21 season (T7/Safeway Open)
- Not in the field for next week's Masters Tournament; would qualify for the 2021 Masters with a victory

Jason Day (T2/-8)

- 12-time PGA TOUR winner seeks first victory since 2018 Wells Fargo Championship
- Making fifth start of the season: T38/U.S. Open, MC/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, WD/THE CJ CUP @ SHADOW CREEK, T60/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP
- Making first start in the Vivint Houston Open since 2011 (T8/2008, MC/2010, MC/2011)
- First of 12 PGA TOUR wins came in Texas (2010 AT&T Byron Nelson at TPC Four Seasons Resort in Irving, Texas)
- One of 37 players in the field that will compete in next week's Masters Tournament and one of 22 that made the cut

Carlos Ortiz (T2/-8)

- Seeks first win in 118th career start on TOUR (career-best result: T2/2019 Mayakoba Golf Classic)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (6.785); entered the week T192 in that category on the season
- Earned TOUR card for the first time in 2014-15 after winning three times on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2014
- Graduate of the University of North Texas and resident of Dallas
- One of two players on the PGA TOUR from Mexico (other: Abraham Ancer)

Sepp Straka (4th/-7)

- Career-best PGA TOUR result: 3rd/2019 Barbasol Championship
- First and only PGA TOUR member from Austria; no player from Austria has ever won on the PGA TOUR
- Looking to become the 14th player from the University of Georgia to win on the PGA TOUR

Additional Player Notes

- Reigning FedExCup champion and World No. 1 **Dustin Johnson** recorded his second consecutive 66; enters the final round three strokes off the lead in second start of the season and first since the U.S. Open (T6)
- **Brooks Koepka**, who served as player consultant on the course renovations at Memorial Park, shot a 5-under 65, tied for the lowest score of the week
- Defending champion Lanto Griffin (T54) is 4-over after rounds of 72-71-71 in first title defense on TOUR
- Six players have earned their first PGA TOUR victory at the Vivint Houston Open since 2000
