Temperatures will be much cooler with temperatures holding the 60s through the morning before warming into the 70s this afternoon.

**Extended Forecast** – A warm front will lift north into the region ahead of a low-pressure system and act as a conveyor belt for showers and thunderstorms on Friday, especially late in the day into Friday night. This area of low-pressure is expected to slowly move across the Midwest, keeping areas of rain and isolated thunderstorms over the region into early next week. Depending on where the low pressure is located will make a big difference in the coverage of rain showers across the area. Heavy rainfall will be likely, depending on where the stronger rain bands set up.
