Things to Know

- Dustin Johnson wins the Masters Tournament by five strokes, his second major championship title and 24th win on the PGA TOUR
- Johnson moves into a tie with Gary Player for 26th on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list
- At 20-under 268, Johnson sets Masters Tournament scoring record for 72 holes
- Johnson has at least one win in each of his 14 PGA TOUR seasons, tying Tiger Woods for the third-longest streak to begin a career in TOUR history
- Johnson becomes the eighth player (ninth instance) to win the Masters after finishing runner-up the year prior
- For the first time in his major championship career, Johnson successfully converts 54-hole lead/co-lead to victory (now 1-for-5)
- Johnson, the reigning FedExCup champion, moves to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings
- Cameron Smith (67-68-69-69) becomes first player to record four scores in the 60s at the Masters

- At 20-under 268, sets Masters Tournament scoring record for 72 holes, breaking previous record of 270 (Tiger Woods/1997, Jordan Spieth/2015); also tied opening 54-hole scoring record (16-under 200)
- Second career major championship title (2016 U.S. Open, 2020 Masters Tournament)
- 24th career PGA TOUR victory; moves into a tie for 26th with Gary Player on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list

- Extends his streak of consecutive seasons with a win to start his PGA TOUR career to 14, tying Tiger Woods for third-longest all-time (longest: 17, Jack Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer)
- Records 11th consecutive under-par score at the Masters, breaking Tiger Woods' record for longest streak in tournament history (Woods' streak: R3/2000 – R4/2002)
- First World No. 1 to win the Masters Tournament since Tiger Woods in 2002
- First World No. 1 to win a major championship since Rory McIlroy at the 2014 PGA Championship
- First World No. 1 to win on TOUR since he won the 2020 TOUR Championship

- Eighth player (ninth instance) to win the Masters Tournament following a runner-up finish the year prior

- Seventh consecutive top-10 on TOUR, including six results of T2 or better: T2/PGA Championship, Won/THE NORTHERN TRUST, P2/BMW Championship, Won/TOUR Championship, T6/U.S. Open, T2/Vivint Houston Open, Won/Masters Tournament
- Fifth consecutive top-10 at the Masters (T6/2015, T4/2016, T10/2018, T2/2019, Won/2020; DNP/2017)
- Reigning FedExCup champion

Second-Round Lead Notes

- Johnson is the 33rd 36-hole leader/co-leader to win the Masters and first since Patrick Reed in 2018
- Johnson is the third 36-hole leader/co-leader to win on TOUR in 2020-21, joining Hudson Swafford (Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship) and Martin Laird (Shriners Hospitals for Children Open)
- Johnson improves to 12-for-21 with the 36-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR
- Johnson improves to 2-for-4 with the 36-hole lead/co-lead in major championships

Third-Round Lead Notes

- Johnson is the 47th 54-hole leader/co-leader to win the Masters and first since Patrick Reed in 2018
- Johnson is the third 54-hole leader/co-leader to win on TOUR in 2020-21, joining Sergio Garcia (Sanderson Farms Championship) and Martin Laird (Shriners Hospitals for Children Open)
- Johnson improves to 11-for-22 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead in 72-hole events on the PGA TOUR
- Johnson improves to 1-for-5 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead in major championships

Additional Player Notes

- **Cameron Smith** (67-68-69-69) becomes first player in Masters Tournament history with four scores in the 60s
- **Sungjae Im** (T2) becomes the third-youngest player to finish in the top five at the Masters; only Jordan Spieth (2014, 2015) and Tiger Woods (1997) did so at a younger age
- **Tiger Woods** made a septuple-bogey-10 at the par-3 12th, the highest score of his PGA TOUR career on any hole (previous: 9, No. 3/R3/1997 the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide); Woods then birdied five of his next six holes to finish T38
- 2019 U.S. Amateur champion **Andy Ogletree** (T34) earns low amateur honors
