Things to Know

- Justin Rose attempts to become the first wire-to-wire winner at the Masters since Jordan Spieth (2015)
- Rose holds his 16th second-round lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR (4-for-15 to date)
- Dustin Johnson becomes the first World No. 1 to miss the cut at the Masters since Justin Rose in 2019 and the first defending champion to miss the cut since Sergio Garcia (2018)
- Will Zalatoris attempts to become first player to win in Masters debut since 1979
- Jordan Spieth sits inside the top-4 on the leaderboard at the midway point of the Masters for the fifth time
- Spieth and Justin Thomas both enter the third round in the top 10 in a PGA TOUR event for the 10th time
- Bryson DeChambeau records nine-stroke turnaround from round one to jump to T17
- An amateur failed to advance to the weekend for the first time at the Masters since 2015
- Notables to make the cut on the number include past champions Phil Mickelson and Adam Scott
- Notables to miss the cut include Dustin Johnson, Brooks Koepka, Sergio Garcia, Rory McIlroy, Jason Day

Justin Rose (1st/-7)

- Playing in his 60th round at Augusta National Golf Club, followed an opening-round 65 with an even-par 72
- Has nine birdies on the back nine through two rounds, tied for the most at the Masters in the last 30 years
- Holds his 16th second-round lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR (4-for-15 to date; most recently winning the 2019 Farmers Insurance Open
- Only prior 36-hole lead/co-lead in a major championship: 2004 Masters (T22)
- Is the first player to lead outright after each of the first two rounds since Jordan Spieth (2016/T2)
- Five wire-to-wire winners of the Masters (Jordan Spieth/2015, Raymond Floyd/1976, Jack Nicklaus/1972, Arnold Palmer/1960, Craig Wood/1941)
- 2013 U.S. Open champion is making his 67th major championship appearance
- Most recent of his 10 PGA TOUR victories came at the 2019 Farmers Insurance Open
- Finished T2 in 2015 and 2nd in 2017 for his best finishes in 15 prior appearances at the Masters

Will Zalatoris (T2/-6)

- Birdied final three holes for a 4-under 68, moving within one of Justin Rose
- Would become the first player to win in his debut Masters appearance since Fuzzy Zoeller in 1979
- Would become the first player to earn first PGA TOUR win in a major since Danny Willett at the 2016 Masters
- Making his third major championship start (MC/2018 U.S. Open, T6/2020 U.S. Open)
- Has 10 top-25 finishes in 14 starts this season

Jordan Spieth (T4/-5)

- 2015 Masters champion leads field with 30 greens hit in regulation, his most through two rounds at the Masters
- Sits inside the top-4 on the leaderboard at the midway point of the Masters for the fifth time (2014/3rd/finished T2, 2015/1st/won, 2016/1st/T2, 2018/4th/3rd, 2021/T4/TBD)
- Would become the first Masters champion to have a triple bogey (No. 9/R1) and still win
- Would become the 18th multiple winner of the Masters
- Winner of last week's Valero Texas Open; the last player to win on TOUR the week before winning a major was Rory McIlroy (2014 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational, 2014 PGA Championship)
- Four top-three finishes in seven starts at the Masters (T2/2014, Won/2015, T2/2016, T11/2017, 3rd/2018, T21/2019, T46/2020)

Additional Player Notes

- Former University of Georgia standout **Brian Harman** (T2) opens with matching 69s; two of three top-10 finishes this season have come in last two starts (T3/THE PLAYERS Championship, T5/WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play)
- One stroke shy of his personal-best score at the Masters, **Marc Leishman** (T4) posted a 5-under 67; scoring breakdown for the week: Nos. 1-4 (6-under), Nos. 5-18 (1-over); hoping to join Adam Scott as Aussie winners at the Masters
- Justin Thomas (T6), winner of THE PLAYERS Championship in 2021, had his only bogey of the day on the par-4 18th to post a 5-under 67; has improved his finish at the Masters in each start since his tournament debut; marks the 10th time he and Jordan Spieth have both been inside the top 10 through two rounds of a PGA TOUR event (he accounted for the only victory in those events at THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES in 2019)
- **Bernd Wiesberger** (T6) recorded a 6-under 66 (tied with **Tony Finau** for round of the day) for his first sub-70 score in 22 rounds at the Masters; has never missed a cut in six appearances at Augusta National Golf Club
- **Hideki Matsuyama** (T6) posts 1-under 71 for his ninth straight par-or-better score at the Masters; has finished inside the top 20 in five of his last starts at Augusta National, led by a fifth place showing in 2015
- **Cameron Smith** (T13) would become the ninth player (10th instance) to win the Masters Tournament following a runner-up finish the year prior (most recent: Dustin Johnson/2020)
- Bryson DeChambeau (T17) follows 76 with a 5-under 67 for a nine-stroke turnaround his largest in a major championship between rounds one and two; FedExCup leader is the only multiple winner on TOUR this season
- With an even-par 72, Jon Rahm (T21) cards his 13th consecutive par-or-better round at the Masters
- Playing in his 100th round at the Masters, two-time champion Jose Maria Olazabal (T40) posted a 1-under 71 to make his first cut at the event since 2014
- Three-time champion **Phil Mickelson** (T48) makes the cut on the number for his 26th weekend appearance in 29 starts; most cuts made at the Masters: Jack Nicklaus (37), Gary Player (30), Fred Couples (30), Raymond Floyd (27), Bernhard Langer (27), Mickelson (26)
- **Dustin Johnson** (MC) becomes the fifth (six times) World No. 1 to miss the cut at the Masters: Greg Norman (1990, 1997), Nick Price (1995), Martin Kaymer (2011), Justin Rose (2019)

- Six players making their Masters Tournament debut: Will Zalatoris (T2), Robert MacIntyre (T21), Charles Osborne (MC), Tyler Strafaci (MC), Joe Long (MC), Carlos Ortiz (MC)
- For the first time since 2015, an amateur failed to make the cut: Osborne (+8), Long (+10), Strafaci (+17)
- Matthew Wolff was disqualified for signing an incorrect scorecard
