Things to Know

- 22-year-old Garrick Higgo wins the Palmetto Championship at Congaree by one stroke, earning his first PGA TOUR title in his second career start
- Higgo, a three-time winner on the European Tour, is immediately eligible for PGA TOUR membership through the 2022-23 season and the 2021 FedExCup Playoffs
- Higgo is the first player to win in one of his first two career PGA TOUR starts since Jim Benepe won the 1988 BMW Championship in his TOUR debut
- Chesson Hadley bogeys the final three holes and finishes T2, becoming the first player to fail to convert a 54-hole lead of four strokes or more on the PGA TOUR since Justin Thomas at the 2019 Genesis Invitational

- First PGA TOUR title in second career start at the age of 22 years, 1 month, 1 day
- Immediately eligible for PGA TOUR membership through the 2022-23 season
- If he accepts membership, is eligible for the 2021 FedExCup Playoffs and would move to No. 80 in the FedExCup standings
- Last player to win in first or second career PGA TOUR start: Jim Benepe, 1988 BMW Championship (debut)
- Last non-member to win on the PGA TOUR: Matthew Wolff, 2019 3M Open
- Youngest winner on the PGA TOUR since Sungjae Im at the 2020 Honda Classic (21 years, 11 months)
- Entered the final round trailing by six strokes, the largest 54-hole deficit overcome by a winner since Bubba Watson won the 2018 Travelers Championship (6)
- Second left-handed player to win on TOUR this season (first: Phil Mickelson, PGA Championship)

- Second player from South Africa to win on TOUR this season (first: Branden Grace, Puerto Rico Open); last season with multiple winners from South Africa: 2015-16 (Charl Schwartzel/Valspar Championship, Grace/RBC Heritage)

Additional Player Notes

- After entering the final round with a four-stroke lead, **Chesson Hadley** bogeys the final three holes and finishes T2, becoming the first player to fail to convert a 54-hole lead of four strokes or more on the PGA TOUR since Justin Thomas at the 2019 Genesis Invitational (4)
- With a T2, **Bo Van Pelt** earns his best result on the PGA TOUR since a solo-second at the 2012 Quicken Loans National (career win No. 74 for Tiger Woods)
- With his top-10 result, **David Lipsky** (T8) is exempt for the Travelers Championship in two weeks
