Today – An approaching cold front will lead to increasing chances for showers/T-storms as the day progresses. Scattered shower/T-storm development is most likely between 1-3pm with activity gradually becoming more organized and widespread. The highest chances for precipitation at the course favor 5-9pm. Most likely rainfall through 6pm today: 0.25-0.50"; with locally higher amounts possible in T-storms. Temperatures should reach the lower 80s with a westerly wind. **Sunrise: 6:15am / Sunset: 8:31pm**

Extended Forecast – Clusters of showers/T-storms are likely tonight, especially before midnight. Rainfall amounts could exceed 1 inch before activity diminishes overnight. The forecast for Sunday remains tricky with a weak area of low pressure developing off the Carolina coastline. Models continue to show an aggressive signal for precipitation during the day, although the position of the low would favor most activity staying offshore and over SE Georgia where the better instability will be located. Precipitation chances were kept on the lower side and favor the 9am-2pm timeframe, however chances may have to be raised in the next update. A typical summer sea-breeze pattern returns on Monday with a slight chance for an afternoon shower/T-storm.
