Today – Stronger westerly flow will be in place, and this will lead to partly cloudy skies and mainly dry conditions today. The sea breeze will have a tough time reaching the course this afternoon, thus the chances for a shower/T-storm have been capped at 20%. Winds will be out of the southwest much of the day and could approach 15 mph during the afternoon. A high in the lower 90s is expected. **Peak Heat Indices: 95-100F** **Sunrise: 6:15am / Sunset: 8:31pm**

Extended Forecast – Friday will be the hottest and the breeziest day of the week as the pressure gradient increases ahead of an approaching front. The increased flow will keep the sea breeze pinned to the coast, however isolated shower/T-storm development during the afternoon can't be ruled out due to the incoming front. Much higher shower/T-storm chances are anticipated on Saturday, especially during the afternoon/evening as the front pushes through. This front likely stalls out off the coast with the potential for an area of low pressure to spin up offshore. There is still significant uncertainty with this feature and whether it can push precipitation back into the area. Given the continuing uncertainty, low chances for showers/T-storms have been maintained on Sunday.
