Things to Know

- In Puerto Rico Open debut, Branden Grace finishes eagle-birdie to claim second career PGA TOUR win
- Jhonattan Vegas birdies four of first five holes en route to best finish since 2017
- Puerto Rico native Rafa Campos claims career-best finish on the PGA TOUR
- Grayson Murray nets best finish since winning on the PGA TOUR in 2017
- Since 2014, the only 54-hole leader/co-leader to convert for the Puerto Rico Open win was Viktor Hovland in 2020

Branden Grace (-19/1st)

- In his Puerto Rico Open debut, South Africa native finished eagle-birdie on the 71st and 72nd holes, respectively, to shoot a bogey-free 6-under 66 and claim his second career PGA TOUR title at the age of 32 years, 9 months, 8 days in his 149th start
- The win comes five weeks after losing his father, Peter, to complications associated with COVID-19
- With the win, collects 300 FedExCup points; it took 376 points to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in 2019 (last full regular season), 659 for BMW Championship and 1,254 for the TOUR Championship
- Victory comes in his 12th start of the season and follows a T20 at last week's The Genesis Invitational
- First won on the PGA TOUR at the 2016 RBC Heritage
- Earns a two-year exemption to the PGA TOUR, taking him through the 2022-23 season
- If not otherwise exempt, earns a spot into the following TOUR events (among others): 2021 Arnold Palmer
 Invitational presented by Mastercard, 2021 THE PLAYERS Championship, 2021 PGA Championship, 2021 the
 Memorial Tournament and 2022 Sentry Tournament of Champions

Additional Player Notes

Coming off a T9 in last year's Puerto Rico Open, Venezuela's Jhonattan Vegas (-18/2nd) birdied four of his first five
holes en route to a 7-under 65, tying the day's low score; was seeking his fourth career PGA TOUR title and first
since the 2017 RBC Canadian Open; the runner-up finish comes in his sixth Puerto Rico Open start and follows a T9
in 2020 when he posted the course record of 10-under 62 (final round)

- Puerto Rico native and 54-hole co-leader **Rafa Campos** (-16/T3) used a final-round 2-under 70 to claim his third top-10 finish at the Puerto Rico Open (T8/2016, T10/2017) and his best PGA TOUR finish (previously 7th/2017 Vivint Houston Open)
- Playing out of the Korn Ferry Tour's 2018-19 top-125/top finishers category, **Grayson Murray** (-16/T3) closed with a 2-under 70 to claim his best PGA TOUR finish since winning his lone TOUR title at the 2017 Barbasol Championship (also an additional event); in only other Puerto Rico Open start, missed last year's cut; most recent of five top-10 finishes on TOUR before this week came at The American Express in 2020 (T10)
- Making his fifth start in the Puerto Rico Open, Brice Garnett (-15/T5) birded four of his last five holes to close with a 7-under 65 and match Jhonattan Vegas and Emiliano Grillo for the day's low score; played Nos. 10-18 in even par the first three rounds; was working towards his second career TOUR title and first since the 2018 Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship
- 36-hole leader **Brandon Wu** (-14/T7) closed with a 2-under 70 to claim his first career top-10 finish on the PGA TOUR in his seventh professional start
- Following a T2 and T3 in his last two Puerto Rico Open starts in 2015 and 2020, respectively, **Emiliano Grillo** closed with a bogey-free 7-under 65 to finish T11 at 13-under 275; most recent top-10 finish before this week was a T8 at the Mayakoba Golf Classic earlier this season
