Professional Rules of Play

EACH TEAM CONSISTS OF TWO PLAYERS (12 TWO-PERSON TEAMS).

FIRST ROUND

Friday, December 11

Approximate Tee Times: 10:15 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.

Format: Scramble

Each player hits a drive on every hole and the best drive is selected. Each player then plays a second shot from the spot where the selected drive lays and the best second shot is selected.

The process is repeated until the hole is completed.

SECOND ROUND

Saturday, December 12

Approximate Tee Times: 11:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

Format: Modified Alternate Shot

Each player hits a drive on every hole and one drive is selected. The player whose drive is NOT selected hits the second shot and they alternate shots until the ball is in the hole.

FINAL ROUND

Sunday, December 13

Approximate Tee Times: 9:35 a.m. - 10:50 a.m.

Format: Four-Ball

Each player plays through every hole using his or her own ball. The player whose score is the lowest on each hole will be the team score for that hole.



Significant Moments

This week the QBE Shootout, currently the longest running post-season event on the PGA TOUR, is celebrating its 30th anniversary. Here is a brief look at some of the highlights through the years:

- In 1989 at Sherwood Country Club in Thousand Oaks, California Curtis Strange and Mark O'Meara
 become the inaugural champions of what was then the Ronald McDonald Children's Charities
 Invitational hosted by Greg Norman. Strange and O'Meara are the only team to shoot all three rounds
 in the 60s, resulting in a six-stroke victory. Greg Norman and his inaugural partner Jack Nicklaus
 finish tied for third.
- The best performance by any team in the history of the event came in 1990 when Fred Couples and Raymond Floyd shot a 15-under-par 57 in the alternate shot format during the second round. Using Couples' 300-plus drives much of the round, Floyd was sharp with the wedge at Sherwood Country Club. He holed a 25-foot bunker shot for an eagle and also chipped in for an eagle. "Fifteen under par for a round of golf is phenomenal," said Arnold Palmer. "It is pretty much unheard of. Fifteen under par is a lot of golf." Said Floyd: "I can't remember ever having so much fun on a golf course."
- In 1992, Franklin Funds, now Franklin Templeton, becomes the title sponsor of the event. To this day, the California-based company continues providing support for the event.
- In 1998, tournament host Greg Norman wins his first and so far only Shootout with partner Steve Elkington. The team beat John Cook and Peter Jacobsen with a birdie on the third hole of a playoff.
- The final chapter of the Shootout at Sherwood Country Club ends in 1999 with Fred Couples and David Duval earning the title. It is Couples' third win in ten years with three different partners. Ironically, the six-shot victory is the same as his first title with Raymond Floyd.
- After a ten-year run in California, the Shootout moves to Florida in November of 2000 and is contested at Doral Resort & Spa on the Greg Norman-designed White Course. Brad Faxon and Scott McCarron pick up the first of what would be back-to-back titles.
- The Shootout moves to Naples in 2001 to begin what is now the longest-running venue in tournament history. Players, amateurs, broadcast partners and corporate partners find the Greg Norman-designed Tiburón Golf Club and The Ritz-Carlton the perfect setting.
- Brad Faxon and Scott McCarron become the first team to successfully defend their title with a victory in 2001. Hank Kuehne and Jeff Sluman would later match the feat with victories in 2002 and 2003.

- At the 2002 Shark Shootout, Cape Coral resident Nicholas Marchitto walked the fairways as the guest
 of Greg Norman. At the time, he was 6-years old and just finished treatment for a malignant soft
 tissue tumor in his abdomen. As he walked down the 18th hole with Norman, he tipped his hat to the
 crowd which cheered and stood for several minutes.
- In 2004, Heather Trzyna, then 13, and her brother Erik, then 9, were the honorees. Heather received a standing ovation at the pro-am awards ceremony after talking about her family's battles with cancer.
 A few years, Heather landed a role on Disney's Wizards of Waverly Place. She starred on the show for two years (2007-08) then in the summer of 2010 volunteered her time in the tournament office, giving back to the charity.
- In 2006 Jerry Kelly and Rod Pampling become the first team to win the Shootout with a bogey
 on the final hole of competition. They defeat Justin Leonard and Scott Verplank on the first hole of a
 playoff.
- Greg Lang was the tournament's honoree in 2006. Sadly, he later lost his life to cancer but not
 before graduating from high school—one of his biggest goals. "He was on cloud nine," Ann Lang said
 of her son's appearance at the Shootout. "In his heart it meant the world to him knowing that
 there was an organization primarily focused at helping children."
- The 2009 honoree for the tournament was Sebastian Gillen, a survivor of Neuroblastoma. He spoke
 about his fight with cancer at the pro-am dinner and upon finishing Greg Norman asked him for his
 hand-written speech and NBC's Jimmy Roberts said, "You are an extraordinary young man. I will
 never forget the words you had to say." The video of Sebastian's speech resides on the tournament's
 website to this day.
- With the tournament date in December, teammates Rickie Fowler and Bubba Watson could not help but celebrate the Christmas holiday in 2010. Upon finishing their round on Saturday, the two changed into Santa Claus outfits, then returned to the crowd surrounding the 18th hole and distributed candy. The crowd cheered wildly.
- The team of Harris English and Matt Kuchar tie the tournament 54-hole record with a 34-under-par 182 and posted a record seven-stroke victory in 2013. Their 54-hole total is also the record for Tiburón Golf Club. With rounds of 60-58 on the weekend, the team also matched the best final 36-hole record established by Fred Couples and Raymond Floyd in 1990.
- In the spring of 2017, QBE is announced as the new title sponsor of the Shootout. Criteria for players
 qualifying for the Shootout is also adjusted and is comprised of its defending champions playing
 as a team, the top 12 committed professionals from the current year's final FedExCup standings and
 10 special exemptions; a minimum of four which will come from the top 40 on the PGA TOUR Career
 Money List.
- In the fall of 2019, QBE extends title sponsorship, keeping the tournament in Naples through 2022.
