#### Things to Know

- In his 61<sup>st</sup> career PGA TOUR start, Sam Burns records his lowest opening 36-hole total with 129
- Burns holds his first lead/co-lead after any round on TOUR
- Harry Higgs cards the first albatross of the 2020-21 PGA TOUR Season for a 10-under 62, his lowest round on TOUR
- Phil Mickelson hit 4 of 14 fairways en route to a 5-under 67 to advance to the weekend
- Notable players to miss the cut: Jordan Spieth, Sergio Garcia, Brandt Snedeker, Shane Lowry
- 5-under 139 is the lowest cut in relation to par at the Safeway Open (previous low: 3-under 141 in 2016 and 2018)
- Rocco Mediate is the only player to convert a 36-hole lead/co-lead into victory at the Safeway Open (2010)

#### Sam Burns (1<sup>st</sup>/-15)

- Round included nine birdies, which ties for most in his PGA TOUR career (most recent: R4/2020 The American Express)
- With 16 birdies, recorded the most total birdies through 36 holes at the Safeway Open since 2014
- In only previous Safeway Open start, posted scores of 72-74—146 to miss the cut in 2018
- Best of five top-25 finishes last season was a T6 at The American Express in Palm Springs; advanced to the FedExCup Playoffs for a second-consecutive year before ending his season at No. 111 in the FedExCup
- Best of 60 PGA TOUR starts is T3 from the 2018 Sanderson Farms Championship

# Harry Higgs (2<sup>nd</sup>/-13)

- Closed out his round with an albatross on No. 9 with a 4-iron, holing out from 230 yards for the third albatross in tournament history (Morgan Hoffman/No. 18/R1/2016, Nicholas Thompson/No. 11/R3/2009)
- First albatross on TOUR since Johnson Wagner at 2019 The RSM Classic (R1/No. 15)
- Bogey-free 10-under 62 is his career-low round on the PGA TOUR (previous best: 63/R3/2020 The American Express)

- In the second round, led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (6.194), Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (5.094)
- In his only other start at the Safeway Open, finished T23 in 2019
- Was one of four PGA TOUR rookies to qualify for 2020 BMW Championship, ending the season No. 55 in the FedExCup standings, highlighted by a second-place showing at the Bermuda Championship

#### Russell Knox (T3/-12)

- Joins Mark Anderson as the only two players in the field without a bogey through 36 holes
- Making his sixth start in the Safeway Open; best showing of T9 came in his 2012, his first start at this event
- Seeks his third career PGA TOUR title and first since the 2016 Travelers Championship

### Cameron Percy (T3/-12)

- Recorded his best opening 36-hole total on TOUR since a 131 at the 2018 Barbasol Championship (finished T7)
- Comes off a T7 finish in last year's Safeway Open, his lone top-10 finish of the season
- Best finish on TOUR is a P2 at the 2010 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open in his first season on TOUR
- Winner of the 2014 Price Cutter Charity Championship on the Korn Ferry Tour and five events on PGA TOUR of Australasia

# D.J. Trahan (T3/-12)

- Bogey-free round of 7-under 65 was highlighted by three straight birdies on Nos. 16-18
- Playing in his fifth Safeway Open and first since 2012 (best finish: T39/2009)
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner (2006 Sanderson Farms Championship, 2008 The American Express)
- Made seven cuts in 17 starts in the 2019-20 season and finished No. 153 in the FedExCup standings

#### **Miscellaneous Notes**

- Two-time PGA TOUR winner **James Hahn** (T6/-11) carded a 7-under 65 for his best round on TOUR since a 62 at the 2018 Sony Open in Hawaii (R4); Led the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (4.66) in the second round
- In his Safeway Open debut, Doug Ghim (T6/-11) recorded a 6-under 66 and seeks his first TOUR win in his 30<sup>th</sup> career start
- In his first TOUR start since winning the Charles Schwab Series at Ozarks National in his PGA TOUR Champions debut, **Phil Mickelson** (T34/-6) hit 4 of 14 fairways, carding a 5-under 67 to make the cut for the fourth time in his sixth tournament start
- **Jordan Spieth** missed the cut with rounds of 73-70, as the 2015 U.S. Open champion heads to Winged Foot GC next week looking for his first victory since The Open Championship in 2017
- In his eighth PGA TOUR start, Akshay Bhatia (T34/-6) made the cut for the first time with rounds of 66-72
- Other notables to miss the cut: Sergio Garcia (-3), Shane Lowry (-3), Brandt Snedeker (-1)
