Things to Know

- Stewart Cink picks up seventh PGA TOUR victory and his 100th career top-10 on TOUR
- At 47 years old, Cink becomes the oldest winner on TOUR since Phil Mickelson at the 2019 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- The win marks 4,074 days since his last TOUR victory at The Open Championship in 2009
- Harry Higgs finishes eagle-par-par to record his second career runner-up finish
- Doc Redman closes with six straight birdies for his career-low round on TOUR
- Phil Mickelson hit 12 of 56 fairways for the week to finish T44
- Mark Anderson becomes the first player since Scott Piercy in 2019 to play 72 holes without a bogey and not win

Stewart Cink (1st/-21)

- Picks up seventh PGA TOUR victory in his 596th TOUR start at the age of 47 years, 3 months, 23 days
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and leads the standings for the first time in his career
- Fully Exempt through the 2022-23 season and earns a spot in 2021 Sentry Tournament of Champions, 2021 THE PLAYERS Championship, 2021 Masters Tournament, 2021 PGA Championship, among other events
- Oldest winner on TOUR since Phil Mickelson (48 years, 7 months, 26 days) at 2019 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Second oldest winner of the Safeway Open behind Rocco Mediate (47 years, 10 months) in 2010
- 4,074 days since defeating Tom Watson in a four-hole aggregate playoff at The Open Championship in 2009
- Earned his 100th career top-10 on TOUR; First player since Matt Kuchar (2019 Sony Open in Hawaii) to win in their 100th career top-10 finish
- His 23-year-old son, Reagan, was on the bag as his caddie for the week
- Led the field in par-3 scoring average (2.56), playing it in 7-under
- Round highlighted by a chip-in birdie on the par-3, 11th hole from 20 feet, 3 inches

• Ties his best score to par in a four-round PGA TOUR event (previous best: -21/2002 Buick Challenge and 2013 The American Express)

Harry Higgs (2nd/-19)

- Played the par-5s in 14-under par this week, highlighted by an eagle (No. 16/R4) and an albatross (No. 9/R2)
- Earned second career runner-up finish (2019 Bermuda Championship)
- The albatross in the second round on No. 9 was with a 4-iron, holing out from 230 yards
- Was one of four PGA TOUR rookies to qualify for 2020 BMW Championship, ending the season No. 55 in the FedExCup

Miscellaneous Notes

- After making the turn in 1-over 37, **Chez Reavie** (T3/-18) rebounded with a 7-under 29 on the back, including four straight birdies on Nos. 10-13; Led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (9.806) and Driving Accuracy (41 of 56 fairways hit)
- **Doc Redman** (T3/-18) ended his day with six straight birdies to card a bogey-free 10-under 62, his career-low round on TOUR (previous best: 63/R4/2020 Travelers Championship, 63/R3/2020 Wyndham Championship)
- In his 11th appearance at the Safeway Open, Kevin Streelman (T3/-18) recorded his first top-10 finish at the event
- 54-hole co-leader Brian Stuard (T3/-18) recorded his best finish at the Safeway Open in his eighth tournament start
- Mark Anderson (T36/-12) posted a 4-under 68 to become the first player since Scott Piercy at the 2019 AT&T Byron Nelson to play 72 holes without a bogey and not win
- **Phil Mickelson** (T44/-10) birdied three of his last four holes to card a 2-under 70 and had a streak of 48 consecutive holes without a bogey this week (No. 4/R1 through No. 6/R4), which is one hole shy of his career record of most consecutive holes played without a bogey in the ShotLink era (49/2004 The Open Championship)
- Chesson Hadley wins the weekly RSM Birdies Fore Love program with 26 birdies or better to earn \$50,000 for a charity of his choice; Hadley beat Kevin Streelman, who also had 26 birdies, by recording more birdies or better in the final round
