Things to Know

- Martin Laird and Patrick Cantlay, past champions of the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, share the 54-hole lead in their attempt to join Jim Furyk and Kevin Na as multiple winners of the event
- Cantlay holds the first 54-hole lead/co-lead of his PGA TOUR career; Laird is 1-for-4 to date
- Cantlay looks to join Tiger Woods, Tom Watson, Jack Nicklaus as the only players to win or finish second at the same PGA TOUR event in four consecutive years
- Laird is attempting to become the first player competing as a sponsor exemption to win on TOUR since Matthew Wolff at the 2019 3M Open
- Matthew Wolff posts career-low 61; becomes fifth player since 1983 with three eagles on either the front or back nine
- After just three double bogeys or worse in his first 18 rounds at TPC Summerlin, Bryson DeChambeau makes two in his first six holes on Saturday and posts even-par 71
- 2019 champion Kevin Na stands T7 in attempt to join Jim Furyk as the only back-to-back winners of the event

- 9 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the **event** since it became a 72-hole tournament in 2004 (Most recent: Kevin Na/2019)
- 1 54-hole leader/co-leader to win on TOUR in 2020-21 (Sergio Garcia/Sanderson Farms Championship)

Martin Laird (T1/-20)

- Eagled the par-5 ninth hole for the second straight day, carding a bogey-free 6-under 65
- Has played the last 37 holes without a bogey

- 2009 champion would join Jim Furyk (1995, 1998, 1999) and Kevin Na (2011, 2019) as multiple winners of the event
- Leads or co-leads field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (9.253), Driving Accuracy (36 of 42, including 14 of 14 in R3), Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (6.579)
- After finishing 19-under 265, won the 2009 event in a playoff over Chad Campbell and George McNeill; followed with a playoff loss to Jonathan Byrd in 2010, who made a hole-in-one in the playoff to win
- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for fifth time on TOUR and second at the event: 2015 Waste Management Phoenix Open (T5), 2011 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard (Won), 2010 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open (P2), 2010 THE NORTHERN TRUST (P2)
- Making his 12th start at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open with both top-10 finishes coming in back-to-back seasons (won/2009, T2/2010)
- Suffered a torn meniscus in his left knee prior to the Return of Golf at the Charles Schwab Challenge in June
- Competing on a sponsor exemption; last player to win on TOUR as a sponsor exemption: Matthew Wolff/2019 3M Open

Patrick Cantlay (T1/-20)

- Bogey-free 65 leads to the first 54-hole lead/co-lead of his PGA TOUR career (99th start)
- 72-under in 15 rounds at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open
- One win (2017) and two runner-up finishes (2018, 2019) in three prior starts at the event
- Looks to join Tiger Woods, Tom Watson, Jack Nicklaus as the only players to win or finish second at the same PGA TOUR event in four consecutive years

Matthew Wolff (T3/-18)

- Sat 1-under on the day through eight holes, before birdie-birdie-eagle-par-eagle-par-eagle-birdie stretch resulted in career-low 61 (one shy of course record); previous-best round was third-round 62 on the way to 2019 3M Open win
- Fifth player since 1983 with three eagles on either the front or back nine (Nos. 11, 13, 15) on the PGA TOUR
- First player with three eagles in a round on TOUR since Collin Morikawa at the 2020 Waste Management Phoenix Open (R3)

Bryson DeChambeau (T31/-13)

- Posted a third-round even-par 71, including a 5-over start through the first six holes
- Double bogeys or worse at TPC Summerlin: first 18 rounds (3), Saturday (2; Nos. 2, 6)
- Making his first start since winning the U.S. Open, his seventh PGA TOUR victory
- Last to win first two starts of the season: Ernie Els, 2003 (Sentry Tournament of Champions, Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Seeking back-to-back wins for second time in career (2018 THE NORTHERN TRUST, Dell Technologies Championship)
- Winner of the 2018 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open (four prior starts: T36/2016, T7/2017, Won/2018, T4/2019)

Additional Player Notes

- After following an 8-under 63 with a third-round 65, **Wyndham Clark** (T3) records multiple rounds of 65 or better for the first time in 61 starts on the PGA TOUR; finished a career-best T5 at the 2019 3M Open (won by Matthew Wolff); has advanced to the FedExCup Playoffs in both full seasons on TOUR, finishing No. 64 in 2018-19 and No. 110 in 2019-20
- **Brian Harman** (T3) is making his sixth start at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, with top-20 finishes in his last two starts (T18/2019, T15/2016); currently No. 95 in the FedExCup standings, in search of his 10th straight trip to the FedExCup Playoffs (never finished worse than 94th (2013))
- **Austin Cook** (T3), who notched his lone PGA TOUR victory at The RSM Classic in 2017, is in search of his first top-10 finish since the 2019 Barbasol Championship (T4)
- Defending champion **Kevin Na** stands T7 (-17); Jim Furyk (1998, 1999) is the only back-to-back winner at the event
- Playing on a sponsor exemption, **Will Zalatoris** (T7) recorded a 64 for the second straight day; in search of third top-10 in fourth start (T6/U.S. Open, T8/Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship); played last 41 holes without a bogey
- **Adam Hadwin** (T9) posted a 9-under 62, his lowest round since a third-round 59 at The American Express in 2017; finished T4 last year with a closing 8-under 63

- **James Hahn** (T9), competing on a Major Medical Extension, needs at least 140 FedExCup points in his next 12 starts (including this week) to remain in the Major Medical category for the remainder of the season (3-way T3 or better would earn him 140 points)
