Things to Know

- **Kevin Na** birdies the 18th hole to secure a one-stroke victory over Chris Kirk and Joaquin Niemann to win the Sony Open in Hawaii, his fifth PGA TOUR career win
- In the final start under his Major Medical Extension, **Chris Kirk** (T2) earns enough FedExCup points to remain in that category for the remainder of the season; entered the week needing 148.934 points to do so and earned 245 points with the two-way T2
- After picking up his first runner-up finish last week at the Sentry Tournament of Champions, Joaquin Niemann's runner
 up finish this week makes him the first player since Webb Simpson (2019) with consecutive runner-up finishes in
 consecutive weeks on TOUR
- **Brendan Steele** follows up his record-setting third-round 61 and 54-hole solo lead with a final-round 69 en-route to finish T4 (-19/261)
- Defending champion Cameron Smith finished T62 at 8-under

- It is Na's second final-round comeback victory. At the 2018 Military Tribute at The Greenbrier, Na closed with a 6-under 64 to erase a one-shot deficit and win by five.
- Sets career-best 72-hole score with his 259 total (Previous: 261, three times)
- Na's rank in the FedExCup standings improves 88 positions to 10th place marking his 49th career week ranked inside the top 10 of the FedExCup and 13th week in the last two PGA TOUR seasons.

- First top-10 since he finished ninth at the 2020 Memorial Tournament
- Posts four rounds in the 60s for the third time at the Sony Open in Hawaii (T36/2017, T20/2011)
 Wins for the fourth consecutive season (2019-2020: 2019 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, 2018-2019: 2019
 Charles Schwab Challenge, 2017-2018: 2018 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier)
- Victory comes in his 424th start at the age of 37 years, 4 months, 2 days
- Has collected four wins in his last 55 starts
- Cumulative stats: 31/56 fairways, 55/72 greens, 108 putts

Chris Kirk (-20/T2)

- Records four consecutive rounds of 5-under 65s en-route to a cumulative 72-hole total of 260/-20
- 11th start at the Sony Open in Hawaii. Previous best finish was in 2014 (solo 2nd) and has two additional top-10s
- In the final start under his Major Medical Extension, earns enough FedExCup points to remain in that category for the remainder of the season; entered the week needing 148.934 points to do so and earned 245 points with the two-way T2

Joaquin Niemann (-20/T2)

- After picking up his first runner-up finish last week at the Sentry Tournament of Champions, Joaquin Niemann's
 runner up finish this week makes him the first player since Webb Simpson (2019 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational,
 2019 Wyndham Championship) with consecutive runner-up finishes in consecutive weeks on TOUR
- 2021 marked Niemann's second start at the Sony Open (2020/T57)

Additional Player Notes

- **Webb Simpson** (-19/T4) recorded four consecutive rounds in the 60s at the Sony Open in Hawaii en route to a 19-under 261. With his T4 finish, he holds the longest active streak of top-20 finishes at the event (7)
- Simpson has made eagle on his final hole of a PGA TOUR event 4 times, one of which came at the Sony Open in 2013
- **Brendan Steele** follows up his 54-hole lead and record-setting third-round 61 with a final-round to finish T4. His 16th eagle in a final round is the 27th most of any player in a final round (158 final rounds)
- Following an opening-round 66, Marc Leishman records three consecutive rounds of 65 to finish T4.
- Matt Jones shot 13-under in his last two rounds marking the second lowest score to par in his final two rounds of a PGA TOUR Event (2019 Barbasol Championship, T4)
- 2013 champion **Russell Henley** (T11) sought to become the tournament's sixth repeat winner, finishing four strokes off the lead
- Making his 20th consecutive start at the Sony Open in Hawaii, **Charles Howell III** (-15/T19) posted four consecutive rounds in the 60s this week; of his 76 rounds at Waialae, 62 have been in the 60s and 68 at par-or-better; a 3-over 73 to open in 2010 is his worst score at the Sony Open
- Defending champion **Cameron Smith** finished T62 at 8-under
