

- 6** Six consecutive top-20 finishes at the Sony Open in Hawaii, tied most of any player since 2013. **Webb Simpson** has the longest active streak of top-20 finishes at the Sony Open in Hawaii entering 2021 (6).
- 28' 3"** Since the start of last season, **Collin Morikawa** has the second-best Proximity to the hole average on approaches from 175-200 yards (min 100 attempts). Morikawa averages 28' 3" in proximity to the hole on these approaches since the start of the 2019-20 PGA TOUR season.
- 188** **Marc Leishman** has made 188 total birdies at the Sony Open in Hawaii, second most of any player at this event since 2009 and his most in an event on TOUR.
- 294** **Hideki Matsuyama** has spent 294 weeks inside top-125 of FedExCup standings, tied-most since 2013-14 PGA TOUR season

Jimmy Walker (2015) won the Sony Open in Hawaii after losing to Patrick Reed at the Sentry TOC.
- 5** **Cameron Smith** was the fifth Australian to win a PGA TOUR event in Hawaii since 1969
- 8** **Sungjae Im** has shot under par in each of his last eight consecutive Second Rounds, marking the second time in Sungjae Im's PGA TOUR career with a streak of eight (or more) consecutive rounds under par in Round Two.
- 17** **Carlos Ortiz** is 17 strokes better in his last two Sony Open in Hawaii starts (-9) compared to his first two starts at this event (+8)
- 5** **Harris English** is the fifth player this season to end a winless drought on the PGA TOUR of more than six years (7 years, 1 month, 24 days)
- 66.87** In his last 23 rounds, **Matt Kuchar** has a 66.87 stroke average at the Sony Open in Hawaii, 3.17 strokes better than his 70.04 stroke average in his first 23 rounds at this event. Kuchar is 73 total strokes better in his last 23 rounds (-72) than in his first 23 rounds at the Sony Open in Hawaii (+1).
- 93.06%** **Adam Scott** hit a field leading 93.06% of his greens in regulation en route to his T21 finish at last week's Sentry Tournament of Champions, marking his career-best Greens in Regulation percentage in an PGA TOUR event.

Collin Morikawa is set to make his second Sony Open in Hawaii start and seventh of the 2020-21 PGA TOUR season. Morikawa is currently 83rd in the FedExCup standings and is coming off his first top-10 finish this season (T7/Sentry TOC).

Three-time PGA TOUR winner Harris English is set to make his ninth start at the Sony Open in Hawaii. Harris has a 67.69 opening two round scoring average at the Sony Open in Hawaii, marking his second-best Opening two round average in a PGA TOUR event (min 2 starts).

Fast Facts on Harris English:

- 5** Harris English is the fifth player this season to end a winless drought on the PGA TOUR of more than six years (7 years, 1 month, 24 days)
