#### Things to Know

- THE CJ CUP @ SHADOW CREEK moves to Las Vegas for one year after being staged in Jeju Island, South Korea since 2017
- Field highlighted by six of the world's top-10 players in the Official World Golf Ranking, including defending champion and two-time winner Justin Thomas
- Brooks Koepka makes his first start since August, following an eight-week break to recuperate from injury
- 11 South Koreans in the field, along with 2 additional players of Korean descent
- Shadow Creek, a Tom Fazio design, hosts a PGA TOUR event for the first time
- THE CJ CUP is one of two tournaments on the PGA TOUR that has been won by a top-five player in the OWGR in each of the last three seasons

- 23 of the top 30 in the Official World Golf Ranking, including six of the top-10 players: Jon Rahm (No. 2), Justin Thomas (No. 3), Rory McIlroy (No. 4), Collin Morikawa (No. 6), Xander Schauffele (No. 8), Tyrrell Hatton (No. 10)
- Five past FedExCup champions: Billy Horschel (2014), Jordan Spieth (2015), Justin Thomas (2017), Justin Rose (2018), Rory McIlroy (2016, 2019)
- Both past winners of the event: Justin Thomas (2017, 2019), Brooks Koepka (2018)
- 11 South Korean players: Byeong Hun An, Jeongwoo Ham, Sungjae Im, Sung Kang, Hanbyeol Kim, Joohyung Kim, Seonghyeon Kim, Si Woo Kim, Jaekyeong Lee, K.H. Lee, Tae Hee Lee

- Justin Thomas picked up his 11th PGA TOUR title and second win at THE CJ CUP
- Thomas picked up his fourth win in Asia in only nine starts
- Byeong Hun An posted the highest finish by a Korean player with T6

### Justin Thomas (FedExCup No. 50, World No. 3)

- Owns four victories in 10 career PGA TOUR starts in Asia (2015 CIMB Classic, 2016 CIMB Classic, 2017 THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES, 2019 THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES)
- Leads the TOUR in fall wins (4) since the wraparound schedule started in 2013-14 (no other player has more than two in that span)
- Holds the best first-round score (63/2017), best second-round score (63/2019), low 36-hole total (131/2019) and the low 54-hole total (201/2019/tied with Danny Lee) at THE CJ CUP
- Making fourth start at THE CJ CUP (Won/2017, T36/2018, Won/2019)

## Brooks Koepka (World No. 11)

- Making first start on TOUR since a missed cut at the Wyndham Championship
- Seven-time PGA TOUR winner, highlighted by a win at THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES in 2018
- After posting rounds of 69-75 in defense of his title, withdrew prior to his third round at THE CJ CUP in 2019 due to a knee injury
- Making third start at THE CJ CUP (Won/2018, WD/2019)
- Finished the 2019-20 season No. 104 in the FedExCup standings; withdrew prior to the start of THE NORTHERN TRUST due to injury

## Rory McIlroy (FedExCup No. 50, World No. 4)

- 18-time PGA TOUR winner
- Making tournament debut at THE CJ CUP
- Finished T8 at the 2020 U.S. Open in September, his second consecutive top-10 at the event and fifth total
- Concluded the 2019-20 season tied for eighth in the FedExCup standings, highlighted by a win at the WGC-HSBC Champions

#### Sungjae Im (FedExCup No. 29, World No. 23)

- CJ brand ambassador
- 2018-19 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year
- Making third start at THE CJ CUP (T41/2018, T39/2019)
- Has collected seven top-10 finishes in each season on TOUR (2018-19, 2019-20)
- Won his first career PGA TOUR title at The Honda Classic in February, carding a final-round 66 to win by one stroke

## Joohyung "Tom" Kim (World No. 125)

- CJ brand ambassador
- Making fourth career PGA TOUR start (MC/2020 PGA Championship, T67/2020 Safeway Open, T33/Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship)
- As a 17-year-old, secured three wins on the Asian Development Tour in 2019 and earned playing rights on the Asian Tour for the remainder of the season; Won the Panasonic Open India for his first Asian Tour title at the end of 2019
- Won the 2020 Gunsan Country Club Open in July to become the youngest winner on the Korean PGA Tour at the age of 18
  years, 21 days

# **Miscellaneous Notes**

• THE CJ CUP is one of two tournaments on the PGA TOUR that has been won by a top-five player in the OWGR in each of the last three seasons (other: World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational); In all three seasons, the same player won both tournaments (2017-18: Thomas; 2018-19: Koepka; 2019-20: Thomas)

- Largest margin of victory: 4 (Brooks Koepka/2018)
