Today – Mixed to mostly cloudy skies with temperatures forecast to top out in the low 80s. Isolated areas of drizzle could occur this morning. A few showers and pop-up thunderstorms may develop around midday and will remain possible into the early evening. Easterly winds will become southeasterly and will increase to 10-15 mph by the early afternoon.

Forecast rainfall through 8pm: Less than 0.10", locally higher in any afternoon thunderstorm.

Extended forecast – Hurricane Henri is forecast to track to the north today and Sunday and make landfall as a tropical storm or category 1 hurricane over Long Island around midday Sunday. The official track has Henri making landfall over central portions of Suffolk County on Long Island, or about 60 miles east of Liberty National Golf Club. Henri's final path may yet wobble slightly west or east. The outer rain bands of Henri will arrive early Sunday morning with rain continuing through the day. Total rainfall accumulation of 2-4" is anticipated by Monday morning, with locally higher totals possible. A few embedded thunderstorms will be possible in the strongest rain bands. Expect northerly winds to turn westerly, becoming sustained at 20-30 mph with common gusts of 30-40 mph and higher peak gusts near 45 mph. The forecast winds may potentially increase if Henri trends further west. Henri is expected to move inland and weaken to a tropical storm Sunday night. Henri will rapidly diminish to a tropical depression over western Massachusetts on Monday.
