Today – Mostly cloudy to overcast skies with an isolated risk for a passing shower or two this morning. A few showers and perhaps a stray thunderstorm could occur this afternoon. The radar will be active across Pennsylvania throughout the day, with rain and embedded thunderstorms becoming likely in the NYC metro area overnight. An isolated strong to severe storm may occur overnight into early Thursday, with damaging winds possible.

Forecast rainfall: Less than 0.10", locally higher in an isolated thunderstorm. **Sunrise:** 6:10am / **Sunset:** 7:50pm

Extended forecast – Rain will become likely overnight into early Thursday and may be heavy at times as remnant moisture from Tropical Storm Fred moves into the region. In addition to the rain, a few embedded thunderstorms will be possible overnight into early Thursday morning. A strong to severe thunderstorm cannot be ruled out between 1-5am Thursday, with damaging winds possible. The latest guidance suggests most of the rain will shift east of the area by 8-9am on Thursday. A few showers or thunderstorms may redevelop Thursday afternoon should cloud cover dissipate and allow for instability to recover. A trough of low pressure moving from the Lower Great Lakes to New England Friday through Sunday will keep chances for showers and thunderstorms in the forecast, with the highest chances expected during the afternoon hours each day.
