Things to Know

- 2014 The RSM Classic winner Robert Streb defeats 2015 tournament winner Kevin Kisner with a birdie on the second hole of sudden death, No. 18
- Kevin Kisner claims a fourth top-5 finish in The RSM Classic, more than any player
- 2020 marks the sixth playoff in The RSM Classic history and third in as many seasons
- Cameron Tringale posts career-low 8-under 62 to claim a sixth top-3 finish on the PGA TOUR
- Sea Island resident Harris English birdies six of his first eight holes en route to a third top-10 finish in his fifth start of the season
- Camilo Villegas claims his first top-10 finish on the PGA TOUR since the 2017 Valero Texas Open
- Corey Conners wins the 11-week-long RSM Birdies Fore Love competition, good for \$300,000 for the children- or family-based charitable organizations of choice; this week's winner, Doug Ghim, collects \$50,000 for similar charities of his choice

- 36- and 54-hole leader closed with a 2-under 68 to force sudden death with 2015 tournament winner, Kevin Kisner; won on the second extra hole, No. 18, with a tap in birdie
- Win comes in his 214th career PGA TOUR start at the age of 33 years, 7 months, 15 days
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and moves to No. 8 in the standings
- With the win, gains entry into a number of 2020-21 PGA TOUR events, including the Sentry Tournament of Champions, PLAYERS Championship and Masters Tournament
- Wins in his 165th PGA TOUR start since his 2014 The RSM Classic victory
- Both The RSM Classic victories have come via sudden death; defeated Will MacKenzie and Brendon de Jonge in 2014

- Becomes the first player to capture his first two TOUR victories at the same event since Daniel Berger (2016-17 FedEx St. Jude Classic)
- Becomes the first two-time winner of The RSM Classic
- Becomes the fifth consecutive 36-hole leader/co-leader to win The RSM Classic: Robert Streb (2020), Tyler Duncan (2019), Charles Howell III (2018), Austin Cook (2017), Mackenzie Hughes (2016)
- Lone bogeys of the week came at his 11th hole in round one (Seaside) and No. 13 in round four (Seaside)
- Wins in seventh start in The RSM Classic; in five starts between victories, never finished higher than T25 (2015)
- Finished the 2019-20 PGA TOUR Season at No. 145 in the FedExCup
- In 40 starts on the Korn Ferry Tour, won twice (most recently the 2018 Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship over Peter Malnati in sudden death)

Miscellaneous Notes

- 2015 The RSM Classic winner Kevin Kisner (-19/P2) closed with a 7-under 63 to collect his fourth top-5 finish in his 10th start at The RSM Classic, more than any player (1st/2015, P2/2020, T4/2017, T4/2014); was in search of his fourth career TOUR title and first since the 2019 World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play
- Cameron Tringale (-18/3rd) posted a career-low 8-under 62 in his 10th start in The RSM Classic, besting his previousbest finish of T20 (2019); Since 2009, of players seeking their first TOUR title, Cameron Trinagle has the second-most starts of any player without a win (288); Ricky Barnes has 289
- Sponsor exemption **Bernd Wiesberger** birdied five of his first nine holes en route to a 7-under 63 and T4 finish at 17-under 265; marks his best PGA TOUR finish in his 56th start; Austria native has amassed 10 international victories, including three on the European Tour in 2019
- Camilo Villegas (-16/T6), who lost in a playoff to Mackenzie Hughes at The RSM Classic in 2016, posted four rounds of par-or-better in a PGA TOUR event for the first time since the 2017 CIMB Classic
- Saint Simons Island resident **Zach Johnson** (-16/T6) took a triple-bogey-eight at No. 7, resulting in a 2-under 68; was seeking a 13th career TOUR title and first since the 2015 The Open Championship
