## **TOUR Championship field bios, FedExCup history**

### **Patrick Cantlay – No. 1 (-10)**

---

#### **2020-21 season notes:**

**Wins:** 3, ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP @ SHERWOOD, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, BMW Championship

**Starts:** 23

**Top-10s:** 6

#### **How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:**

- Held a share of the lead after the second and third rounds of the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open before finishing T8
- Shot a final-round 65 to win the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP @ SHERWOOD, earning his third career PGA TOUR victory in his 101st career start. Victory came in his native California after the tournament moved from Japan due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Made nine birdies in the final round to edge Jon Rahm and Justin Thomas by a stroke
- Shot a final-round 61 to finish solo-second at The American Express, one stroke shy of Si Woo Kim's 23-under total. Made 20 birdies over the final 36 holes, becoming the first player on record (since 1983) to make 20 or more in the final two rounds of a 72-hole non-major PGA TOUR event
- Held a two-stroke lead after 18 holes of the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am before finishing T3. Shot a first-round 62, becoming the third player in tournament history to shoot a 62 or better at Pebble Beach Golf Links; took over the FedExCup standings lead with the finish
- Defeated Collin Morikawa in a playoff to win the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide for the second time, earning his fourth PGA TOUR title and second of the season; became the seventh multiple winner of the Memorial Tournament and third past Jack Nicklaus Award recipient to go on to win the Memorial Tournament (Tiger Woods, Jon Rahm); reclaimed the FedExCup standings lead with the victory
- Became the season's only three-time winner with a six-hole playoff victory over Bryson DeChambeau at the BMW Championship; secured the FedExCup lead with his fifth career PGA TOUR victory

- Opened the season with a T8 finish at the 2020 U.S. Open, his third consecutive top-10 in major championships and eighth total.
- Held a share of the 54-hole lead at The American Express before finishing T4
- Recorded back-to-back runner-up finishes at the Farmers Insurance Open and The Genesis Invitational, which marked his seventh and eighth career runner-up results on TOUR
- Finished T10 at the Masters Tournament in April, his third top-10 in four starts at the event; added his third top-10 of the season in major championships with a T8 at the PGA Championship
- Entered the Playoffs at No. 23 for the second consecutive season before defeating Cameron Smith in sudden death at THE NORTHERN TRUST to win his second career PGA TOUR title and first since the 2016 Puerto Rico Open; secured his fifth consecutive trip to the TOUR Championship

**Bryson DeChambeau – No. 3 (-7)****2020-21 season notes:****Wins:** 2, U.S. Open (2020), Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard**Starts:** 21**Top-10s:** 8**How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:**

- Won the 2020 U.S. Open by six strokes over Matthew Wolff, earning his first major championship title and seventh win on the PGA TOUR. Became the 12<sup>th</sup> player to win the U.S. Amateur and the U.S. Open. Moved to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the first time since the 2018 TOUR Championship.
- Earned his eighth career PGA TOUR title and second of the season, winning the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard by one stroke over Lee Westwood. Became the first multiple winner of the season. Led the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (1.761 per round) and Driving Distance (321.3 yards).
- Finished T3 at THE PLAYERS Championship, earning his first top-10 in three starts at the event. Played in the final group with Lee Westwood after doing so at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard; the pair became the first to play in the final group in consecutive PGA TOUR events since Adam Scott and Vijay Singh in 2007.
- Held the 36-hole lead and a share of the 54-hole lead at the BMW Championship before losing on the sixth playoff hole to Patrick Cantlay after the duo matched 72-hole totals of 27-under par. The week included a second-round 60 at host Caves Valley Golf Club. The finish pushed him from No. 9 to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings.
- Spent 12 weeks at No. 1 in the FedExCup standings entering the TOUR Championship.

- Finished T2 at the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP @ SHERWOOD for his first top-10 finish in his third start of the 2020-21 season; began a stretch of five top-10s his next six starts, which included a T7 at the 2020 Masters
- Contended on Sunday at THE PLAYERS Championship before a final-round 73 left him with a T9 at TPC Sawgrass
- Closed with a 66 to add another top-10 finish at the 2021 Masters (T5) for his fourth consecutive top-10 at the event
- Continued his strong form in major championships with a T8 finish at the PGA Championship
- After being forced to withdraw before the final round of the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday with a six-stroke lead, came back to win the 2021 U.S. Open in his next start for his first major title
- In his next start after his U.S. Open title at Torrey Pines, fired a final-round 66 at Royal St. George's to finish T3 at The Open Championship and secure his fifth consecutive top-10 result in a major championship
- Held at least a share of the lead after each of the first three rounds of THE NORTHERN TRUST before playing the final four holes in 2-over to miss the playoff by two strokes and finish solo third

- Earned two consecutive top-10 finishes at the 2021 Masters Tournament (T10) and RBC Heritage (T9) before he captured his third career victory
- Along with Marc Leishman, defeated 54-hole leaders Louis Oosthuizen and Charl Schwartzel with a par on the first hole of sudden death at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans. Marked his second win at the event
- Notched another set of back-to-back top-5 finishes at the WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational (T5) and THE NORTHERN TRUST (P2)
- Advanced to the TOUR Championship for the second consecutive season and marks third overall appearance

**Justin Thomas – No. 6 (-4)****2020-21 season notes:****Wins:** 1, THE PLAYERS Championship**Starts:** 22**Top-10s:** 6**How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:**

- Notched three top-5 finishes in his first six starts of the season, including a T2 at the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP.
- Won THE PLAYERS Championship by one stroke over Lee Westwood, earning his 14<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR title in his 165<sup>th</sup> career start at the age of 27 years, 10 months, 13 days. Became the fourth player since 1960 to win 14 times on TOUR before turning 28, joining Tiger Woods, Jack Nicklaus and Johnny Miller. Trailing by seven strokes after 36 holes and became the third player in PLAYERS Championship history to record a score of 132 or better over the final two rounds.
- Shared the first-round lead at THE NORTHERN TRUST after opening with an 8-under 63 en route to a T4. Marked his first top-10 on TOUR since winning THE PLAYERS.
- Moved to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for one week following a T13 at the Valspar Championship.

- Opened with a solo fourth at the 2020 U.S. Open, earning his first career top-10 in a major championship; closed out the 2020 calendar year with four top-10s in six starts
- Won his third PGA TOUR title at the Sentry Tournament of Champions after holding at least a share of the lead after the first three rounds; defeated Joaquin Niemann in a playoff for his first win on TOUR since the 2013 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba; qualified for the event by finishing the previous season in the top 30 of the FedExCup standings
- Returned to the top-five at the 2021 U.S. Open with a solo third finish
- The following week, outlasted Kramer Hickok in an eight-hole, sudden-death playoff to win the Travelers Championship for his fourth career TOUR title and second of the season
- Held the outright lead after each of the first three rounds of the World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational before closing with a final-round 73 to finish solo fourth

- Was one stroke off the 36-hole lead at The American Express before finishing T5
- Added a solo fifth finish at the Valspar Championship before recording his fourth career runner-up result on TOUR at the following week's Wells Fargo Championship; jumped him inside the top 20 in the FedExCup standings for the first time this season

- Earned his first career top 10 in a major championship after recording a field-best final-round 65 at the PGA Championship to finish T8
- World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational, defeating Sam Burns and Hideki Matsuyama in a playoff with a birdie on the second extra hole (No. 18). Became the fourth player from Mexico to win on TOUR. Became the first player since Russell Knox at the 2015 WGC-HSBC Champions to earn his first PGA TOUR victory in a World Golf Championships event. Entered the final round trailing by four strokes before recording a 2-under 68 to get into the playoff.

**How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:**

- Recorded his first top-10 finish of the season at the Waste Management Phoenix Open (T4), where he carded a third-round 61 to take a share of the 54-hole lead
- Held the solo-lead after the second and third rounds of the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am before finishing T3. Recorded second consecutive top-five on TOUR and held the 54-hole lead/co-lead for the second consecutive week
- Finished T4 at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard in his tournament debut, which marked his third top-five of the season
- Won the Valero Texas Open for his 12th career PGA TOUR victory in his 83rd start since his last PGA TOUR victory, the 2017 Open Championship, a span of 3 years, 8 months, 12 days; moved into the top-10 of the FedExCup standings with the victory
- Carded four par-or-better scores to finish T3 at the Masters Tournament in April, his fifth top-five in eight starts at the event. Led the field in Greens in Regulation Percentage (77.78 percent)
- Earned his 14th career runner-up with a solo-second at the Charles Schwab Challenge. Held a one-stroke lead entering the final round before recording a 73
- Finished solo-second to Collin Morikawa at The Open Championship, his 11th top-four result in his 35th career major championship appearance; vaulted him to second in the FedExCup standings behind Morikawa

- Held a two-stroke lead after the second round of the Fortinet Championship before finishing T7; marked his first lead/co-lead after any round on the PGA TOUR.
- Led after the second and third rounds of the Vivint Houston Open before closing with an even-par 72 to finish T7
- Held the outright lead after each of the first three rounds of The Genesis Invitational before finishing solo-third. Led by five strokes after the second round, becoming the first player in tournament history to hold a 36-hole lead of five strokes or more and the first to do so in a PGA TOUR event since Brooks Koepka at the 2019 PGA Championship (7).
- Earned his first PGA TOUR title in his 76th career start, winning the Valspar Championship by three strokes over Keegan Bradley. At 24 years, 9 months, 9 days, became the youngest winner of the Valspar Championship since Jordan Spieth in 2015 (21).
- In his first start after winning the Valspar Championship, held the solo-lead after the second and third rounds of the AT&T Byron Nelson before finishing solo-second, the first runner-up of his PGA TOUR career; moved inside the top five in the FedExCup standings
- Recorded his second runner-up finish of the season after shooting a final-round 64 to get into a three-way playoff at the World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational

- Entering the 2021 portion of the season with no top-10s, recorded back-to-back T7 finishes at the Sentry Tournament of Champions and Sony Open in Hawaii
- Won the World Golf Championships-Workday Championship at The Concession by three strokes, earning his fourth PGA TOUR title and first in a World Golf Championships event. Became the second player to win a WGC and a major championship before turning 25, joining Tiger Woods.
- Finished T8 in his title defense at the PGA Championship

- Lost to Patrick Cantlay in a playoff at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday; marked his third career runner-up on TOUR and sixth top-10 of the season.
- In his next start, overcame an opening-round 75 to finish T4 at the U.S. Open, his second career top-five in a major championship
- Won The Open Championship by two strokes over Jordan Spieth in his tournament debut, earning his second major championship title and fifth PGA TOUR victory. Win came in his eighth career major start and became the first player to win two different majors in his first attempt (PGA Championship, The Open Championship)
- Took over the FedExCup standings lead following The Open Championship and finished the regular season in the same position

- Notched his second career PGA TOUR victory at the 2020 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba, posting 20-under 264 for a one-shot win over Aaron Wise, thanks to a birdie on the 72<sup>nd</sup>



hole. Became the fifth European player since 1945 with multiple PGA TOUR victories before the age of 24, joining Rory McIlroy, Seve Ballesteros, Sergio Garcia and Jon Rahm.

- Recorded T2 finishes at the Farmers Insurance Open and World Golf Championships-Workday Championship at The Concession, moving to a career-best second-place standing in the FedExCup following the WGC runner-up.
- Finished in a two-way tie for third at the Wells Fargo Championship, his second consecutive T3 on the PGA TOUR and sixth top-five of the season. Led the field in Birdies (22). Marked his last top-10 on TOUR entering the TOUR Championship.
