Things to Know

- For the third season, the TOUR Championship is weighted by FedExCup Starting Strokes, with the format crowning a single champion; at the conclusion of the TOUR Championship, the player with the lowest score in relation to par combined with his FedExCup Starting Strokes will win the TOUR Championship and the FedExCup
- FedExCup leader Patrick Cantlay (-17) takes his sixth career 36-hole lead/co-lead with a bogey-free 66
- Jon Rahm birdies five of his last seven holes, including his final three, to record his second consecutive 65
- Bryson DeChambeau hits 15 of 18 greens and birdies his final two holes to remain within six strokes
- Rahm and Cantlay will be paired together for the 20th time in their careers

Patrick Cantlay (1st/-17)

- FedExCup leader birdies the final two holes for a 66 to maintain his lead; marks his first bogey-free round at the TOUR Championship in his 14th career round
- Takes his sixth career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; has yet to convert a 36-hole lead/co-lead
- Hit 16 of 18 greens in round two and Sits T1 in Greens in Regulation Percentage (80.56%) through two rounds
- Entered the TOUR Championship with a cumulative 10-over total at East Lake in three previous appearances
- Making fourth appearance at TOUR Championship (T21/2019, T21/2018, T20/2017)
- Seeks fourth title this season, his first season with more than one victory

Jon Rahm (2nd/-16)

- World No. 1 birdied five of his last seven holes, including the last three, to record his second consecutive 65
- Seeks to become the second consecutive FedExCup champion to win while ranked No. 1 in the world
- Five of his six career TOUR titles have come when trailing after 36 holes
- 36-hole total of 130 (65-65) ties the second-lowest opening 36 holes in tournament history (127, Tiger Woods, 2007)
- Leads the field in total birdies through two rounds (13)
- Making fifth appearance at the TOUR Championship (4th/2020, T12/2019, T11/2018, T7/2017)
- Notched top-10 results at first two FedExCup Playoffs events (T3/THE NORTHERN TRUST, T9/BMW Championship)

Additional Player Notes

- **Bryson DeChambeau** (3rd/-11) hit 15 of 18 greens in round two and birdied his final two holes, including a chip-in on the par-4 17th hole for a 67 to sit solo third and six strokes back; largest come-from-behind win on TOUR after 36 holes is seven strokes (2018 Dell Technologies Championship); a two-time winner this season, owns one top-10 finish in the FedExCup in four previous PGA TOUR seasons (3rd, 2018)
- 2021 PLAYERS Champion Justin Thomas (4th/-10) eagled the par-5 sixth hole en route to his second consecutive 67; holed 118' 3" feet of putts, including a birdie from 60' 7" on the par-4 14th hole, which marks his longest putt made this season; is the only player inside the top 10 after any round of the TOUR Championship since 2016 (22 of 22 rounds); has finished no lower than T7 in five previous TOUR Championship appearances, including a runner-up finish in 2020
- Making his eighth career TOUR Championship appearance, Kevin Na (T5/-9) turned in a bogey-free 67; recorded his second consecutive sub-70 score at East Lake Golf Club for the first time since 2010
- Rory McIroy (T10/-8) closed with a back-nine 30 that included six birdies for a 66; 2016 and 2019 FedExCup is tied for the second-most total birdies through two rounds (12)
- **Billy Horschel** (T13/-7), is in the best position after 36 holes of the TOUR Championship since 2019 among players who began the tournament at even par and 10 strokes back
- 2020 FedExCup champion **Dustin Johnson** (15th/-6) recovered from a double bogey on the par-4 eighth hole with three birdies on the back nine for a 1-under 69; leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (4.589) through two rounds
- Xander Schauffele (T16/-5) recorded his 18th consecutive round of even par or better at East Lake Golf Club
