Things to Know

- For the third season, the TOUR Championship was weighted by FedExCup Starting Strokes, with the format crowning a single champion; Patrick Cantlay, the player with the lowest score in relation to par combined with his FedExCup Starting Strokes, wins the TOUR Championship and the FedExCup
- Cantlay becomes the third player in FedExCup history to rank No. 1 in the FedExCup entering the TOUR Championship and go on to win
- Cantlay becomes first player to win four or more times in a season since Justin Thomas in 2016-17
- Jon Rahm posts his 15th top-10 this season, the most by any player in a season since 2015-16
- Kevin Na plays final 57 holes without a bogey en route to best FedExCup finish of his career
- Sungjae Im notches 498 total birdies for the 2020-21 PGA TOUR Season, the most by any player in a season since 1980

Patrick Cantlay (1st/-21)

- After two birdies and two bogeys on the front nine to make the turn one ahead of Rahm, holed a 5'11" putt for birdie at No. 16 before holing another 5'11" putt for bogey at No. 17 to stay one ahead with one hole to play; on the final hole, hit a 217-yard shot to within 11'4" of the hole and two-putted to win by one stroke
- Becomes the third player in FedExCup history to rank No. 1 in the FedExCup entering the TOUR Championship and go on to win (2009/Tiger Woods, 2020/Dustin Johnson, 2021/Patrick Cantlay)
- First player with four or more wins in a season since 2016-17 (Justin Thomas/5 wins); marks his first season with more than one victory
- Joins Wayne Levi (1990) and Calvin Peete (1982) as players currently without a major championship victory to collect four or more wins in a season in the last 40 years

- Becomes first player to win back-to-back tournaments on TOUR since Brendon Todd (2020 Bermuda Championship, 2020 World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba)
- Now 2-for-3 in converting 54-hole leads/co-leads to victory (2021 TOUR Championship/Won, 2021 BMW Championship/Won, 2020 Shriners Children's Open/T8)
- Becomes 22nd 54-hole leader/co-leader to win the TOUR Championship
- Becomes 17th player this season to claim victory after holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead; wins back-to-back tournaments while holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead in both events (2021 BMW Championship)
- Reached 21-under for the week with a birdie on the par-4 10th in the third round but never got any further under par from that point on before concluding at 21-under
- Entered the TOUR Championship with a cumulative 10-over total at East Lake in three previous appearances
- Fourth appearance at TOUR Championship (Won/2021, T21/2019, T21/2018, T20/2017)

Jon Rahm (2nd/-20)

- Hit 14 of 18 greens while posting 16 pars and two birdies (No. 5, No. 18) en route to final-round 68
- Notches his 15th top-10 finish this season, the most of any player since Dustin Johnson posted 15 in 2015-16 season
- Was seeking to become the eighth international winner of the TOUR Championship and the first from Spain
- Was attempting to join Dustin Johnson as the second consecutive FedExCup champion to win while ranked No. 1 in the world
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Around The Green (4.804)
- Fifth appearance at the TOUR Championship (2nd/2021, 4th/2020, T12/2019, T11/2018, T7/2017)
- FedExCup Playoffs results: T3/THE NORTHERN TRUST, T9/BMW Championship, 2nd/TOUR Championship

Additional Player Notes

- Making his eighth career TOUR Championship appearance, **Kevin Na** (3rd/-16) records his third consecutive bogey-free round with a final-round 67; completes 72 holes at East Lake with just one bogey (R1/No. 15), fewest of any player in the field; 3rd marks his best result in the FedExCup (previous best, 24th in 2014)
- **Justin Thomas** (4th/-15) posts sixth top-10 in six appearances at the TOUR Championship (T6/2016, 2nd/2017, T7/2018, T3/2019, T2/2020, 4th/2021)
- **Xander Schauffele** (T5/-14) holed out from 126 yards for an eagle-2 on hole No. 3 before posting five birdies in his final six holes for a 6-under 64 en route to his 20th consecutive round of even par or better at East Lake Golf Club; posts his fourth top-five finish at the TOUR Championship, tied most of any player since 2017 (with Justin Thomas); ties **Daniel Berger** (T11/-8), who birdied his final four holes, for low round of the week
- **Viktor Hovland** (T5/-14) posts final-round 65 for his seventh top-five finish of the season; in his eight rounds at East Lake six are in the 60s (69-69-68-70-66-68-70-65)
- **Bryson DeChambeau** (7th/-13) ranks No. 1 in Strokes Gained: Off The Tee (4.093) and 27th in Strokes Gained: Around The Green (-1.431)
- The eagle by 2020 FedExCup champion **Dustin Johnson** (8th/-11) at the par-5 6th hole marks his 27th eagle of the FedExCup Playoffs, the most of any player; led the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (9.478) for the week
- **Rory McIlroy** (T14/-7) makes 20 birdies, the most of any player in the field, en route to posting his second-highest result in eight starts at the TOUR Championship (T16/2015)
- **Sungjae Im** (T20/-4) records five birdies on Sunday to notch 498 total for the 2021-22 PGA TOUR Season, surpassing the previous record for most birdies in a season since 1980 (493/Steve Flesch/2000)
- **Collin Morikawa** (T26/E) posts MC-T63-T26 in the three FedExCup Playoffs events after winning the Comcast Business TOUR Top 10 as the leading player through the Regular Season
- **Joaquin Niemann** (29th/+4) plays as a single in the final round, shooting a 2-over 72 in 1 hour, 53 minutes

- The last three 'going for the green' shots on the final hole were the closest of the day: Patrick Cantlay (11'4"), Kevin Na (12'5"), Jon Rahm (18'7")
- Two first-time participants in field: Sam Burns (T18), Erik van Rooyen (T22)
- Five FedExCup champions in the field: Dustin Johnson (8th), Rory McIlroy (T14), Justin Thomas (4th), Jordan Spieth (T20), Billy Horschel (T9)
- Five past winners at East Lake Golf Club in the field: Dustin Johnson (8th), Xander Schauffele (T5), Rory McIlroy (T14), Jordan Spieth (T20), Billy Horschel (T9)
- Six players in the field finished their PGA TOUR season without a victory: Xander Schauffele (T5), Louis Oosthuizen (T14), Sungjae Im (T20), Scottie Scheffler (T22), Corey Connors (T22), Joaquin Niemann (29th)
