Things to Know

Due to COVID-19, the Wells Fargo Championship was not contested in 2020

- Field includes four of top-five players in Official World Golf Ranking: Justin Thomas (2), Jon Rahm (3), Xander Schauffele (4), Bryson DeChambeau (5)
- Defending champion Max Homa comes off T6 at last week's Valspar Championship; no player has successfully defended his title in the event
- 2010, 2015 Wells Fargo Championship winner Rory McIlroy makes first start since the Masters (MC)
- Masters Tournament runner-up and Wake Forest University grad Will Zalatoris to compete on sponsor exemption in 17th start of the season
- The 2022 Wells Fargo Championship will be played at TPC Potomac at Avenal Farm in Potomac, Maryland as the 2022 Presidents Cup is conducted at Quail Hollow Club

2019 Wells Fargo Championship Notes

- Max Homa became the fifth player to claim his first victory at the Wells Fargo Championship joining Anthony Kim (2008), Rory McIlroy (2010), Rickie Fowler (2012) and Derek Ernst (2013)
- Homa won his first career PGA TOUR title came at the age of 28 years, 5 months, 2 days in his third Wells Fargo Championship start

More on Max Homa

- After 2019 Wells Fargo Championship victory, finished No. 60 in the 2018-19 FedExCup Standings
- Earned second PGA TOUR victory at the 2021 Genesis Invitational via playoff (defeated Tony Finau)
- Has four top-10s in 18 starts this season; No. 16 in the FedExCup standings

Wells Fargo Championship and the FedExCup

- The Wells Fargo Championship is the 32nd of 50 events in the 2020-21 PGA TOUR Season
- Seven of the 13 winners of the Wells Fargo Championship have advanced to the season-ending TOUR Championship in the FedExCup era: Tiger Woods (2007), Anthony Kim (2008), Sean O'Hair (2009), Rickie Fowler (2012), Rory McIlroy (2015), Brian Harman (2017), Jason Day (2018)

Select Player Notes

Justin Thomas (FedExCup No. 1, OWGR No. 2)

- Makes fourth Wells Fargo Championship appearance; 2015/T7, 2016/MC, 2018/T21
- Lone major win came at the 2017 PGA Championship at Quail Hollow Club (73-66-69-68-276/-8)
- With a T13 at last week's Valspar Championship, the 2017 FedExCup champion overtook the No. 1 spot in the FedExCup
- Seeks fifth top-five finish in his 14th start of the 2020-21 PGA TOUR Season
- Won THE PLAYERS Championship in March for 14th career TOUR title; has most wins among players younger than 30

Jon Rahm (FedExCup No. 12, OWGR No. 3)

- Makes second Wells Fargo Championship appearance; Finished fourth in tournament debut in 2017
- Seeks a 10th top-10 finish of the season and fifth consecutive: T9/THE PLAYERS Championship, T5/WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, T5/Masters Tournament, 7th/Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Ryan Palmer)
- Leads the TOUR with nine top-10s this season
- Seeks a sixth career PGA TOUR title and first since the 2020 BMW Championship

Rory McIlroy (FedExCup No. 51, OWGR No. 15)

- 2010, 2015 Wells Fargo Championship winner seeks eighth top-10 finish in his 10th start in the event; additional top-10 finishes in 2012/T2, 2013/T10, 2014/T8, 2016/T4, 2019/T8
- Owns 18-hole scoring record of 10-under 61 (R3/2015)
- Won the 2010 Wells Fargo Championship for maiden PGA TOUR title
- Seeks 19th career TOUR victory in his 196th start; most recently won the 2019 World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions
- Best of four top-10 finishes in 2020-21 is T5/2020 Masters Tournament

Bryson DeChambeau (FedExCup No. 2, OWGR No. 5)

- Makes fourth Wells Fargo Championship appearance; 2016/MC, 2017/MC, 2018/4th
- Seeks ninth career PGA TOUR title and third of the 2020-21 season; 2020 U.S. Open, 2021 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard
- Makes first start since T46 at the Masters

Viktor Hovland (FedExCup No. 3, OWGR No. 11)

- Makes first appearance in the Wells Fargo Championship
- Finished T3 at last week's Valspar Championship, his fourth top-five finish since his win earlier this season in Mexico
 (T2/Farmers Insurance Open, T5/The Genesis Invitational, T2/WGC-Workday Championship at The Concession, T3/Valspar
 Championship)
- PGA TOUR titles (2); 2020 Puerto Rico Open, 2020 Mayakoba Golf Classic

Webb Simpson (FedExCup No. 9, OWGR No. 41)

- Makes 12th Wells Fargo Championship appearance; top-10 finishes in 2012/4th, 2015/T2
- Seeks a sixth top-10 finish in his 14th start of the season; in most recent start, finished T9 at the RBC Heritage
- In search of his eighth career PGA TOUR title and first since the 2020 RBC Heritage
- Charlotte resident and 2008 Wake Forest University grad (Religion)

Miscellaneous Player Notes

- World Golf Hall of Fame member **Phil Mickelson** makes 17th consecutive start in the Wells Fargo Championship; holds a tournament-record 10 top-10 finishes, eight of which are inside the top five; First missed cut in the event came in 2019
- Patrick Reed's best finish in seven Wells Fargo Championship starts is eighth (2018); is in search of his 10th career TOUR title, second of the 2020-21 season and first since the 2021 Farmers Insurance Open
- World No. 12 Patrick Cantlay will make first start in the Wells Fargo Championship; is in search of a fourth career TOUR title and second of the season (2020 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)
- A native of nearby Gastonia, North Carolina, **Harold Varner III** makes sixth Wells Fargo Championship appearance; claimed career-best T2 at last month's RBC Heritage
