Things to Know

- Brooks Koepka takes his eighth 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR in search of his second WGC title
- Twelve of 21 leaders through 36 holes at the WGC-Workday Championship since 1999 have gone on to win
- Collin Morikawa closes with 5-under 31 on his front nine and ties course record 64
- Cameron Smith ties career-best score to par through the first 36 holes of an event on TOUR
- Billy Horschel opens with back-to-back 67s and shares the lead in GIR Percentage and Driving Accuracy
- Bryson DeChambeau improves by 13 strokes over his first two rounds (77-64) and ties course record with nine birdies
- Matthew Wolff withdraws before the second round

- Recorded seven birdies before making bogey on his final hole for a 6-under 66
- Eighth 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR, converting two into victory (2017 U.S. Open, 2019 PGA Championship)
- Seeks to become the first multiple winner this season (2021 Waste Management Phoenix Open); no player has
 won multiple tournaments through 19 weeks, the longest streak to start a season since 1994 (Nick Price won his
 second tournament in the 21st week of the season)
- Owns one title (2019 FedEx St. Jude Invitational) and six other top-10s in 17 previous WGC appearances

- Three top-10s in eight starts this season, including his eighth PGA TOUR title at the Waste Management Phoenix Open
- Finished T38 at last week's The Genesis Invitational

Cameron Smith (T2/-10)

- Hit 15 of 18 greens and recorded seven birdies en route to 6-under 66
- Coming off a solo fourth at last week's The Genesis Invitational, his third top-10 in nine starts during the 2020-21 season
- Currently, No. 27, can eclipse his career-high position in the Official World Golf Ranking this week; he last reached his career-high No. 24 following a T6 at the 2019 WGC-Workday Championship
- Looks to become the fifth Aussie to win a WGC, joining Geoff Ogilvy (3), Adam Scott (2), Jason Day (1) and Craig Parry (1); owns two top-10s in 10 previous WGC appearances (T5/2018 Dell Technologies Match Play, T6/2019 Workday Championship)

Billy Horschel (T2/-10)

- 5-under 67 marks his first sub-70 second-round score in sixth tournament appearance
- Two bogeys through two rounds have both come at the par-3 fourth hole
- Shares lead in Greens in Regulation Percentage (80.56) and Driving Accuracy Percentage (92.86) through two rounds; entered the week ranked 62nd and 73rd in those categories, respectively, this season
- Tied his most fairways hit through the first two rounds of a PGA TOUR event with 26 (2012 Sanderson Farms Championship), including his first 21 this week
- Five-time PGA TOUR winner seeks his first individual stroke-play title since the 2017 AT&T Byron Nelson

Collin Morikawa (T2/-10)

- Following an opening-round 2-under 70, tied career-high nine birdies en route to an 8-under 64
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (7.162)
- Making his third WGC appearance this week; best result: T20/2020 FedEx St. Jude Invitational
- Owns two top-10s in eight starts this season (T7/Sentry Tournament of Champions, T7/Sony Open in Hawaii)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Bryson DeChambeau (T20/-3) ties course record and improves by 13 strokes over his first two rounds (77-64),
 eclipsing his best improvement over first two rounds of an event on TOUR (2018 Wells Fargo Championship/75-65); ties career-high nine birdies in a round on TOUR
- Tony Finau (T5/-9) birdied four of his first six holes for a 5-under 67; has sat T5 or better through 36 holes in three of his last four starts on TOUR (The American Express/T2, Farmers Insurance Open/T2, WGC-Workday Championship/T5)
- **Viktor Hovland** (T17/-4) was 7-under on his round before making a quadruple-bogey 8 on the par-4 ninth, his final hole of the day; made five consecutive birdies (Nos. 11-15), his career-best streak on TOUR.
- Defending champion **Patrick Reed** (T8/-8) was 6-under thru 13 holes before bogeys on two of his final five holes led to a 4-under 68
- 18-hole co-leaders Matthew Fitzpatrick and Webb Simpson each carded 3-under 69 in round two and sit T5
- Scottie Scheffler (T13/-5) sits the highest among the five players who competed at the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Championship at The Concession Golf Club: Bryson DeChambeau (T20/-3), Thomas Detry (T35/-1), Xander Schauffele (T35/-1), Jon Rahm (T43/E)
- Matthew Wolff withdrew before the second round and receives last-place unofficial money with no FedExCup
 points
